#### FIVE PILLARS OF ISLAM

- 1. Kalima or Creed: "La ilaha illallahu Muhamadur Rasullullah."
  There is no God but Allah and Muhammad is His Messenger.
- 2. Salat or Prayer: A Muslim has to offer five prayers daily in the prescribed method: standing, bowing, prostrating and sitting, and reciting prescribed formulas of prayer and glorification of Allah. These five prayers are to be offered at five appointed times. These times are Dawn (before sunrise), Early afternoon, late afternoon, after sunset and at bedtime before midnight.
- 3. Saum or Fasting
- 4. Zakat or compulsory alms-paying of 2.5% of accumulated savings.
- 5. Haj or Pilgrimage to Mecca.

Our Faith is Islam which means submission to God, resignation to His will and living in peace with fellow human beings.

Hazrat is accompanied by Hazrat Begam Sahiba, Chaudhri Zahur Ahmad Bajwa (Private Secretary), Principal Muhammad Ali Chaudhri, Nawabzada Shahid Ahmad (his son-in-law), and Mizra Ghulam Ahmad, M. A.; Editor of the Review of Religions.

Hazrat Amizual Momeneen is currently in U. K. Exploring avenues for rthe implementation of his noble scheme. We earnestly pray for his personal health and well being and the success of his objectives. May Allah create unprecented facilities for him to

promote the noble cause he has launched upon.

During his absence from home, Mir Masood Ahmad who has only recently returned from his assignment as Missionary-in-Charge of Denmark Mission, will act as local Private Secretary. # ACTIVITIES AT CAMP HILL

A course in Arabic studies is being offered for credit at the educational facility of the Camp Hill correctional institution in Pennsylvania. Classes are conducted weekly for 3½ hours by Yahya Sharif Abdullah and include "Arabic language, culture, and history" in accordance with the secular limits imposed by atheist government requirements. However, all of the essentials of Islam are contained within the course. Composed largely of Ahmadi brothers who embraced Islam during their interment, the class affords vehicle for organization and development of the jamaat at Camp Hill. Brother Yahya embraced Islam in 1957 and was active in the New York and Baltimore Jamaats before moving to a farm in the York area where he serves as a District Executive of the Scout movement. He began working with the nearby Camp Hill Ahmadis with Amir Bilal Abdus Salaam of Philadelphia who also visits the institution weekly to conduct salat-i-jumaa and afford guidance to the jamaat.

### ISLAMIC CAMP SCHOOL

Mian Muhammad Ibrahim, Missionary, incidentally the Editor of the Ahmadiyya Gazette had an occasion to visit the Islamic Camp School being conducted by Sister Saeeda Latif, at Lothian, Maryland. I had nothing but praise for the organizers, the way they were managing their jobs and the remarkable achievement made by the participants. I gave them a short oral test and was glad to note the wonderful progress they had made in memorizing Salat and traditional prayers. However, I would advocate holding only one school at an ideal place as Lutheran for all American Units rather than running two simultaneously in two different regions.
