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MIRACULOUS BEAUTIES OF THE QURAN

Among the miraculous beauties of the Holy Quran is that of eloquence, which is altogether different and distinguishable from the eloquence of human speech, for the field of the latter is extremely narrow and unless a speech is mixed with exaggerated, false, and unnecessary accretions, no man can attain to the higher degrees of that quality.

Secondly, the miraculous beauty of the Holy Quran is that all the incidents related in it are really all prophecies mentioned in many places.

The third miraculous beauty of the Holy Quran is that the teaching contained in it is fully equipped with the means of carrying human nature to its highest development. It contains all the arguments and signs

Among the miraculous beauties of the needed by man to attain to the stage of ly Ouran is that of eloquence, which is conviction.

The fourth great beauty to be found in it is that it takes a perfect devotee so near to God that he attains to the privilege of Divine communion. He begins to show clear signs indicating such nearness and he attains to purity of spirit and constancy in faith.

There is another special feature of the Holy Quran worth mentioning; namely, that the blessings of heavenly signs given to a perfect believer are from God. They cannot be taken as an index of personal excellence. The sign of a believer's personal superiority being his pure and righteous disposition, the power of his faith and the strength of his constancy. For example, if a

SUMMARY OF FRIDAY SERMON BY KHALIFATUL MASIH III Delivered October 13 1978, at Masjid Agsa, Rabwah, Pakistan

Hazrat Ameerul Momineen, Mirza Nasir Ahmad, Khalifatul Masih III, recited Tashahhud, Ta'awwuz and Sura Fateha and then expressed his gratitude to God the Exalted for enabling him to deliver the Friday Sermon after remaining absent for the longest period out of the Headquarters, since he was entrusted with the reign of Khilafat.

During this period in the course of his journey, God the Exalted favored him and his entourage with His Grace abundantly while extending the shadow of His Grace over here also, hence he is extremely happy.

He also referred to his indisposition due to dental trouble during the final month of his disseminative and educative tour, informing the congregation that he has been relieved of it through the Grace of God to a great extent. The ailmant has passed away through His Grace. I am in constant prayer for you all, he revealed, and asked the congregation to pray for him, that God the Exalted vouchsafe him with healthy and active life. Ameen!

Hazrat Khalifatul Masih related that a part of his preaching tour of Europe is linked with the important International Conference convened in England on the from death on the cross, at London during June 2-4, 1978. Prior to the conference various important newspapers of Europe gave it wide publicity. A journalist even contributed a detailed description of five to six pages on this subject in the Daily Telegraph, which has a circulation of more than a million.

The wide publicity of the conference perturbed the Church over there, which is clear from their Press Release wherein they have indicated their willingness to hold public dialogue, but simultaneously have tried to debar us from publicising the dialogue. Our rejoinder to this invitation was not replied and when they were reminded, a letter was received after a fortnight bearing another person's signature depicting that as the person who communicated earlier has no knowledge of Islam, hence, he shall reply, after necessary consultation. This reply has not so far been received. Huzoor further informed the congregation that the wide publicity of this Conference in the newspapers of the various countries of the world can be judged from the fact that in accordance with the estimate of the experts, our voice has been conveyed to 14 million souls of the world.

The reaction of the Catholic Bishops can be realized from the fact that their majority even failed to reply our letters. Nevertheless, the Bishop of Japan wrote categorically that as they are thoroughly convinced of the divinity of Jesus, they are not prepared to have any dialogue with us on this subject. Reason advocates that whenever there is inconsistency between the two parties over basic beliefs, efforts should be made to remove the conflict by holding dialogue in an atmosphere of love and fairness.

One effect of this conference, continued deliverance of Jesus (peace be on him) the Khalifatul Masih, is apparent from the fact that our Jamaat in America has planned to convene a similar conference over there after a lapse of two years. As the temperament of American people is different from that of the people of England, it is expected that their newspapers would give more publicity than the one given by the English Press. They would perhaps not mind the pressure of the Church to such an extent. Insha Allah.

His help and support during the tour. The Christian scholars and journalists who met him were dumbfounded. A few of them having been impressed by the excellent teachings of Islam, spoke out at once, saying: why have we not been informed of this excellent teaching earlier? As a result of our humble efforts. Khalifatul Masih announced, more than 500,000 Christians have embraced Islam through the grace of God. Yet the chain of our struggle should continue. When Christiandom would relize that the teachings presented by us are better than what they have with them, they will certainly turn towards Islam. Insha Allah. Ignoring the irrefutable arguments and proofs presented by the Promised Messiah (peace be on him) and the excellent commentary of the Holy Quran explained by him, there is nothing else which could attract the developed world towards Islam.

Finally, the Khalifatul Masih remarked, that the realization and reaction this tour has created in his heart is that God the Exalted has entrusted us with very important responsibility. We are to pass through hard and difficult circumstances. We have to discard the life of sloth and must do all we could in carrying out our responsibility, so that the deficiency might be made up by God the Exalted. This is His promise, that do what you can do and the deficiency will be made up by Him, and yet the entire rewards will be given to you. We should supplicate for the entire world, for each country of the world, and particularly for our own country Pakistan, that Allah the Exalted may grant her stability and create a sphere of brotherhood and an excellent society which Islam wishes to form might be established in our country too. NATIONAL IJTEMA'A OF KHUDDAMUL AHMADIYYA

ATHENS, OHIO: The National Ijtema'a of Majlis Khuddamul Ahmadiyya, USA, was held here on July 22nd and 23rd.

The first session began at 9:00 a.m. Saturday, July 22, with National Qaid Yahya Sharif Abdullah presiding. The meeting was opened with recitation from the Holy Quran by Naib Qaid, Alhaj Dhul Waqar Yaqub, followed by collective recitation of the Khuddam pledge. Next followed the raising of the Khuddam and American flags by Khuddam honor branch 4-B (Dayton, Ohio) led by Zaim Umar Faruq Qadafi. Qaid Yahya Sharif welcomed the delegates warmly and outlined the rules and procedures by which the Ijtema was to be conducted. The following branches participated in Ijtema'a

Atlantic City, N.J.; Boston, Mass.; Dayton, Ohio; Chicago, Ill.; Milwaukee, Wis.; New York, NY; Philadelphia, Pa.; St. Louis, Mo.; Teaneck, NJ.; Washington, DC and York/Harrisburgh, Pa. A foreign Majlis of Copenhagen, Denmark, was represented by a delegate, in the person of Br. Ibrahim Lembolt.

Imam Ata Ullah Kaleem, Missionary Incharge and Naib Sadr of Majlis Khuddamul Ahmadiyya, USA, gave the inaugural address for the Ijtema'a. In his inspiring talk, Imam Kaleem read from the concluding address given last year by Khalifatul Masih III at the International Khuddam Ijtema'a in Rabwah, Pakistan.

Following opening ceremonies, sports competitions were held. The featured sport was KABADDY and TUG OF WAR.

Following a light lunch and ZUHAR and ASR SALATS, the assembled delegates heard some inspiring speeches regarding the purpose and importance of Ijtema'a. Imam M.M. Ibrahim, MidWest Missionary, in a brief address commended Khuddam on the dedication they are showing and exhorted Khuddam to continue to strive that Allah

may grant them yet greater success. Alhaj Muzaffar Ahmad Zafr, the Regional President, commended Khuddam on the time and sacrifices which they are putting forth in Khuddam and Jamaat activities. Regional Zaim Eastern Region, Sardar Rafiq Ahmad, then gave a speech entitled A Living Connection with Allah. He emphasized the necessity of a person being pure of heart and submissive to Allah in order to establish strong connection with him. In his speech, the Regional Zaim MidWest Region, Br. Umar Qadafi, exhorted the Ahmadiyya youth to adopt the Holy Prophet Muhammad (peace and blessings of God be on him) as their standard and model for conduct whereby they may strengthen themselves and uphold Islam and Ahmadiyyat.

Next on the agenda was Wilderness Survival Training, which combined a hike in the wooded area surrounding the Camp, lectures and demonstrations on First-Aid techniques, and lectures on how to survive in the wild.

The last activity on Saturday before evening prayers was the Majlis Shura session. This session was presided by the National Qaid. He began the session with an inspiring talk wherein he emphasized that in order for Khuddam to properly uphold and promote Ahmadiyyat, they must fully understand Ahmadiyya's prospectives on KHATAMAN NABIYYEEN, and must understand why the Promised Messiah (peace be on him) is the MUJAD-DID of this millenium

Naib Qaid, Alhaj Yaqub, followed Qaid Yahya's speech with a comprehensive report, including information on the recently conducted Najmul-Huda Khuddam leadership School, preliminary plans for the 1979 National Ijtema'a, and a summary report concerning the current 1978 National Ijtema'a. Naib Qaid Yaqub stated that

another leadership school is planned for the last week in September, to be held in Chicago. Preparations for holding this school are to be directed by Territorial Qaid Nasirullah Ahmad.

The 1979 National Ijtema'a, said Naib Qaid Yaqub, is tentatively scheduled for June 23rd and 24th, 1979, to be held at New Jersey site. He announced that Bro. Jalalud Din Abdul Latif of Montclair, N.J., has been appointed chairman of planning and preparation for the 1979 National Iitema'a.

National Qaid Yahya then gave a talk on Khuddam administrative procedures, explaining how the levels of administration -National, Regional and local - relate to each other. Regarding National Khuddam leadership, Qaid Yahya stated that much of Khuddam activity will presently come under the offices of four Nazims, the Nazims respectively of Public Information, Talim and Tarbiyyat, Health and Fitness, and Services. He announced the appointment of Zaim Hasan Abdullah of Atlantic City, NJ, as Nazim of Public Information, and Regional Zaim Umar Qadafi as Nazim of Talim and Tarbiyyat. Bro. Abdul Kabeer Haque remains Nazim of Services and Bro. Jalalud Din Abdul Latif remains as Nazim of Health and Fitness. Focussing on a way to improve Khuddam services, Qaid Yahya stated that Khuddam should take training in skills that qualify them to efficiently perform services beneficial to humanity, especially for disaster relief and the like. Concluding his talk, Qaid Yahya stated that October 28th and 29th have been set as the dates for the next official Mailis-i-Shura session, wherein 1979 activities will, Insha Allah, be planned in detail.

Sunday's Ijtema'a activities began with Tahajjud prayer followed by Salatul FAJR. After prayers, Darsul Quran was offered by Imam Kaleem. This Dars was a thoughtprovoking discourse wherein the Imam exhorted Khuddam to adopt TAQWA (fear of Allah) as one never knows, no matter how young he is, when one's death will come. Whenever the end comes, it should find him submissive to Allah, said Imam Kaleem, who quoted the Promised Messiah (peace be on him) exhort: "Every morning should be a witness for you that you spent the night in righteousness, and every evening should be a witness for you that you spent the day with the fear of God in your heart."

Following Darsul Quran, competition in recitation of the Holy Quran was held. knowledge and in the recitation of Ahadith. Khuddam delegates were divided into regional Malik while second and third went to Bro. Sardar Rafiq Ahmad and Bro. Muhammad Isa Qadafi, respectively.

Following a delicious breakfast, competitions were held in general Islamic knowledge and in the recitation of Ahadith. Khuddam delegates were divided inyo regional teams, one team for each, the Northeast, Southeast, Great Lakes and Midwest regions. In the general knowledge competition, pre-selected questions were offered to each regional team in turn, wherein one member of the team would present an answer to the question. Following a lively competition wherein much knowledge of Islam was exhibited, Bro. Umar Qadafi, Nazim Talim Tarbiyyat, administered a written test to all Khuddam, This test being one designed to evaluate the educational needs of the Majlis as a whole.

First place in both the general knowledge and Hadith quotation competitions went to the Northeast regional team under the leadership of Regional Zaim Sardar Rafiq Ahmad. Second place in the general knowledge competition went to the Southeast regional team under the leadership of Zaim Daud Abdul Malik. There was a tie for second place in Hadith quotations by Southeast and Midwest Regional team;

IMAM KALEEM'S LETTER TO THE WASHINGTON POST

August 16, 1978

Re: Conversion vs Compulsion

Dear Sir::

It would be appreciated if you could kindly spare some space in your esteemed paper to clear the misunderstanding created by your foreign service correspondent, Mr. Thomas W. Lippman in his contribution from Cairo, entitled: "Ramadan: When Islam Fasts and Life Begins at Sunset", which appeared in the Washington Post on Sunday, August 13, 1978.

The correspondent, while describing the Battle of Badr as one of the two great events of Islamic history which took place in the month of Ramadan, has corroborated with his self-assumed modern scholars when he asserted that: "the victory they (300 Muslims) scored over 1000 Meccans, modern scholars say, laid the foundation for Muhammad's temporal power and began the train of propagation of Islam by armed conquest."

This assertion of your correspondent is based on the writings of those bigoted writers who do not allocate blame as well praise where either is due. In the garb of literary service these writers have done noteable disservice not only to the cause of Islam but to humanity itself. When one uses colored glasses, the vision is bound to be colored, but when one looks at an object with the naked eye the color of the object presents itself truly and clearly. The same applies here. It is not so cruel to criticise as to misrepresent a thing. While honest criticism leads to crystallization, misrepresentation clouds the issue and misleads a seeker after truth.

There is nothing more unjust than to impute such a charge to Muhammad, the Prophet of Islam. Such a charge is a gross betrayal of truth. It is an undeniable fact that Muhammad suffered terrible perse-

cutions for a long period of 13 years and was forced to leave his own hometown Mecca, which resulted in his taking refuge in Medina – a town about 270 miles north of Mecca. Even here he was not left in peace. His enemies organized expedition after expedition to put an end to him and his companions by violence and force of arms. He was thus compelled to fight in defense of the right of all men to worship God according to their own lights. A remarkable feature of these battles was that they were fought in or around Medina, a fact which amply shows that it were the pagans who came to attack the Muslims and that the latter were always on the defensive.

Impartial and objective statements of historians stress the point that the idea that Muhammad has waged wars on the opponents for the sake of effecting their conversion is utterly baseless. The well-known writer, Thomas Carlyle, refutes this in his work Heroes and Hero Worship in a convincing manner.

Professor E.G. Browne, like Carlyle, does not believe in this fallacy. He says in his Literary History of Persia:

"It is often supposed that the choice offered by the warriors of Islam was between the Quran and the sword. This, however, is not the fact, for Magians, as well as Christians and Jews, were permitted to retain their religion, being merely compelled to pay Jizyah or Poll tax, a perfectly just arrangement, in as much as non-Muslim subjects of the Caliph were necessarily exempted both from military services and from the alms in Medina Muhammad became a changed man and sought to promulgate his religion by sword.

Professor Hell, a German, however, agreeing with Prof. Browne on the question of tribute, sees in the payment of tribute definite evidence that there was never any

propagation by the sword. He says:

"Following the example of the Prophet, professors of revealed religions — such as Jews and Christians — were allowed, under the protection of the Muslim Empire and on payment of suitable tax, perfect freedom in their religion. ... In the face of these facts there is no question of the propagation of Islam by sword. United by Islam, Arabism was interested in conquering and keeping the conquered as a tax-paying people." (The Arab Civilization, p.47).

Another writer, George Kirk, comes out strongly with the denial that there was ever any forcible conversion at any time. He

says:

"It was also necessary, however, for the new Arab rulers to regulate the legal position of millions of their non-Muslim subjects, who represented the overwhelming majority of the population of the empire. In this Umar followed the example of Muhammad, who had left undisturbed the Christian and Jewish communities of the Northern Hijaz, which he brought under his sway, on condition of the payment of an annual tribute. Umar extended this usage to all the Christian and Jewish inhabitants of the Empire and to the Zoroastrians of Persia. ... Far from there being any idea of forcibly converting them to Islam, their role was to provide revenue for the Arab ruling race by payment of taxation, the conversion of non-muslims was actually discouraged, as it would have lessened the number of taxpayers," (A Short History of the Middle East, London, 1948).

Prof. T.W. Arnold gives a remarkable refutation to the oft repeated charge that in Medina Muhammad became a changed man and sought to promulgate his religion

by sword. He says

"From the very beginning, Islam bears the stamp of a missionary religion that seeks to win the hearts of men, convert them and persuade them to enter the brotherhood of the faithful; and it was in the beginning, so has it continued to be upto the present day." (The Preaching of Islam, p.41)

There are scores of other writers like Prof. H.A.R. Gibbs, Rev. Lacy O'Lear, Sir William Muir, Will Durant, Von Kremer, Prof. Flenly Welch and Prof. Phillip K. Hitti, who have expressed similar opinions and have refuted the charge of the propagation of Islam by armed conquest but it would be against the courtesy of the Editor to quote the detailed extracts of these writers.

The Holy Prophet Muhammad never supported warfare for the spread of religion, and it was he whose revelation declared in unmistakeable words that: (the following quotes are from the Quran)

There is no compulsion in Religion (2257)

Say, 'O men, now has the truth come to you from your Lord. So whoever follows the guidance, follows it only for the good of his own soul, and whoever errs, errs only against it. And I am not a keeper over you. (10:109)

And say, it is the truth from your Lord wherefore let him who will, believe, and let him, who will, disbelieve. (18:30)

And if anyone of the idolators seeks protection of thee, grant him protection so that he may hear the Word of Allah then convey him to his place of security. That is because they are people who have no knowledge. (9:6)

The protection referred to in the above verse is during war. This magnanimity of Islam is indeed unparalleled. The verse also cuts at the very root of the Correspondent's allegation that Islam was spread by armed conquest. If it were true, and if early wars of the Muslims were fought in order to spread the faith, how could the Quran possibly have allowed an unbeliever to go away without accepting Islam after the latter had sought protection of the Muslims?

ST. LOUIS, MO.

The Jamaat has tried to get the news of the London Conference on The Deliverance of Jesus from the Cross published in two papers St. Louis Argus (August 3, 1978) and The Monitor (August 17, 1978), with the detailed news of the invitation of the British Council of Churches for a dialogue and its acceptance by the Supreme Head of the Ahmadiyya Movement in Islam, along

with the proposal of holding such dialogue in London, Rome, a West African Capital, an Asian Capital, and the USA, on dates and conditions agreed upon by the parties. The papers state, "The International Islamic Organization claims that Jesus did not die on the Cross but lived to be about 120 years and died in Kashmir, India."

YORK-HARRISBURGH, PA.

The Jamaat is meeting regularly to read the Holy Quran during Ramadhan and organize its program for the coming year. Some rooms in Harrisburgh have been contributed by one of the members to be used as a mosque for the area. Weekly classes for Atfal and Nasirat will commence after Ramadhan and a Nasir Club was organized for the pre-Atfal youth. Eid-al-Fitr will be held at the farm of Yahya Sharif.

AN INTERVIEW WITH MR GHULAM SARWAR TAHIR

Who joined Ahmadiyyat in November, 1974 By Mr. M. A. Saqi

We expect very few readers to know about Mr. Ghulam Sarwar Tahir. However, he represents a growing number of converts in Pakistan who have accepted Ahmadiyyat in spite of a government decree classifying Ahmadies as non—Muslims. We reproduce the text of the interview verbatim and without editorial amendments.

Q:Could you please tell us briefly about yourself?

A: My name is Ghulam Sarwar Tahir. I was born in 1948 at Chak No. 339 at Veroke Kejrey, Lyallpur. Having received six years of primary school education, I moved permanently to Sheikhu Pura and was apprenticed to Haji Nur Muhammad, a local Jewller. I was married in 1967 and I have four children. We have our own jewellry shop where my brothers now assist me. Q: When did you first hear about Ahmadivyat?

A: Our neighbor was an Ahmadi but our relationships never extended to religious doctrines. In 1974, when hostilities against the community started to increase, I enquired for the reasons leading to these hostilities. At that time there was a general instruction to maintain a social boycott with Ahmadies and we had been ordered not to have any relationship with them. I came accross a book which stated that the Holy Prophet was Khatamun Nabiyyeen and I was satisfied that there could be no prophet after the Holy Prophet.

One day I went to the local Ahle-Hadith mosque. The speaker said that even in 1953 there were hostilities against the Ahmadies. The speaker had then been imprisoned but he had not been successful in his mission. He urged the audience to conduct a social boycott and maintained that this boycott would finish the community.

After some time I was happy as Ahmadi shops began to be closed and I

assumed that success had been achieved. Then one day my elder brother, Mr. Muhammad Ramzan, who is respected in all business matters obtained a book. This book said that calamities such as earthquakes, wars, storms and floods occurred most often when people rejected a prophet of Allah. My brother remarked that there had been many wars and lately there had been an earthquake and he wondered if this arose from the rejection of a prophet.

We were surprised to hear this from our brother. In 1953, he had taken part in the hostilities and was a declared opponent of Ahmadiyyat. Yet here he was defending and virtually preaching Ahmadiyyat to us.

My brother prayed to Allah Almighty. He saw a dream in which he saw the faces of the Holy Prophet and the Promised Messiah in a circle accross the sky. The Holy Prophet pointed towards the Promised Messiah and said this is my shadow. Our brother told us about this dream and said that he no longer had any doubts. He also said that a false prophet never survived for long.

So we approached the Amir of the Ahmadiyya Community in Sheikhu Pura, Mr. Ch. Anwar Hussain, and discussed various aspects of faith. After this, on 14th November 1974, my brother was initiated and he became an Ahmadi. Shortly afterwards, I too, became an Ahmadi.

- Q: Were you involved in the disturbances and hostilities against the community?
- A: No. When emotions ran high, we shut our shop and kept away from the hostilities.
- Q: Why did you become an Ahmadi?
- A: After my brother's initiation and after countless meetings with the local Amir, I was clear in my mind. I was particularly impressed by a saying of the Holy Prophet that a time would come when Muslims

would be divided into 72 sects and that only one of them would truly represent Islam. At this time all other so called Muslims stand on one side with the Ahmadies alone, a sect apart. This was an evidence of the saying of the Holy Prophet.

Q: What was the reaction of your relatives and friends to your conversion?

A: My elder brother had already accepted Ahmadiyyat. However, my uncle was very displeased. Similarly, my wife and my father-in-law were most displeased. But when various members of our family saw dreams directing them towards Ahmadiyyat, opposition to us began to subside. It is a great blessing of Allah Almighty that through His Grace, there are today about 75 members of our household who have embraced Ahmadiyyat. I doubt whether any of them accepted Ahmadiyyat other than through directions received in a dream.

Q: Did you ever regret your decision in view of what you know was happening to other Ahmadies and that the same might happen to you?

A: I always reflect with much regret that for a long time I had been deprived from this fountain of guidance. Ever since we became Ahmadies, our contact with Allah has increased and we feel that we have become spiritually more mature. Every day some new truth manifests itself. How can we now abandon this grand blessing. Ahmadiyyat is now more important to us than our lives. There was a time when we were forgetful in offering the obligatory prayers and we knew little about religion. Now that we have found confidence in our faith we are eternally grateful to Allah Almighty.

Q: What do you think about Hazrat Khalifatul Masih III?

A: I have now met Hazrat Khalifatul Masih
III on several occasions. Whenever I
have met him, I have been spiritually
inspired, and on each occasion I have wit-

nessed the bounties and signs of Allah. Once I was in a group of 40 people awaiting to meet Huzur. Just before the meeting, one gentleman said that he would be pleased if he was embraced. Another gentleman said that his faith would increase if he was merely granted a handshake. When it came to be our turn, Huzur shook hands with all 39 and only one person was embraced. That gentleman was the one who was desirous of this embracing.

I have always found warmth in his company and I always seek to remain in his company.

Q: Have you ever tried to influence your friends and relatives to join the Movement?

A: Ever since I became an Ahmadi, I have preached Ahmadiyyat to my friends and relatives and through the grace of Allah Almighty, many have now accepted Ahmadiyyat.

Q: What is the purpose of your present visit to Europe?

A: To witness the opening ceremony of the Gotenberg Mosque in Sweden. I am a delegate of those from Sheikhupura who accepted Ahmadiyyat after the 1974 atrocities. Huzur had said that we should travel outside the country to see the grand scale at which Ahmadiyyat is still marching forward.

Q:What is your advice to those who are not yet in the Movement?

A: My advice to them is not to follow the propaganda perpetuated by the so called scholars of Islam but to seek the truth first hand. Study the community's literature and if possible, visit Rabwah. Immediately upon reaching Rabwah, a number of misunderstandings will be removed. Wrong illusion about heaven and hell will be wiped away. When you hear the call for prayers being made from Masjid Mubarak, you will observe that Ahmadies are indeed Muslims. If you cannot visit Rabwah, I urge you to pray conscientiously to Allah (continued on page 15)
