SUMMARY OF FRIDAY SERMON DELIVERED BY HAZRAT KHALIFATUL MASIH III ON JUNE 8, 1979 AT RABWAH, PAKISTAN.

Ĩn his sermon, Hazrat Ameerul Momineen, Hafiz Mirza Nasir Ahmad, Khalifatul Masih III exhorted the congregation to follow the excellent example of the Holy Prophet (peace and blessings of God be upon him) in doing good to the people. Khalifatul Masih stated, that the Holy Prophet's capacity for welfare is infinite. His welfare encompasses every aspect of human life and each part of the earth. The Holy Prophet (peace and blessings of God be upon him) has given an excellent teaching in this respect. He has exhorted his followers to try to stop injustice and disturbance and not get involved in them. He has forbidden oppression and disturbance for stopping tyranny and mischief. The teaching advocated by the Holy Prophet (peace and blessings of God be upon him), Khalifatul Masih continued, is that when physical efforts and material means do not produce favorable results we should turn to the spiritual vistas. That means we have to pray to God the Exalted, that He may grant reason and understanding to mankind. That they may shun the paths of tyranny and rebellion, and tread the ways of peace and security.

În the world of today, Khalifatul Masih remarked, we witness that man is not loving his fellow beings. Rather men bear enmity to one another. At some places whites are fighting the blacks. At other places there is fighting among the whites themselves, and the blacks are pitched against one another. In short, in the world of today, man is causing trouble for his fellow beings instead of procuring tranquility and peace. We Ahmadies who are privileged to be the followers of the Holy Prophet (peace and blessings of God be upon him), Khalifatul Masih pointed out, have not got the power to do away with this affliction. Besides, wherever we have the capacity to stop it by force, we do not use it to avoid further disturbances. Hence, we should offer supplications. May Allah the Exalted bestow wisdom upon people so they may love each other and respect each other's rights. The present time demands that we should serve mankind through sympathetic prayers. We should supplicate so imploringly that Allah the Exalted accept our prayers and provide means of comfort to humanity so they all start to love each other.

At the start of his sermon, Khalifatul Masih referring to the severity of the current hot weather explained the phenomena weather and related how the seasonal changes emanate from the hundreds of orders created by God the Exalted which function harmoniously for, the benefit of man. PRONOUNCEMENTS OF THE PROMISED MESSIAH BONUS MONEY AND BANK INTEREST

One person asked that from the salary of the Railway employees, one Anna per Rupee is deducted. Later, that money is refunded with some additional money. What is your opinion?

He said, "According to Shariat, interest is defined that a person for his own benefit lends money to another person. Wherever this definition applies, it will be called interest. (But whereas Railway employees themselves do not give that money for interest purposes, instead it is deducted forcibly, it does not fall under interest. Therefore, you can see that you give this money for interest or they deduct it by themselves and refund without demand.) The one who borrowed and did not promise but returns it with addition and with the intention that it is not interest then this also does not fall under interest. It is a gift from management. The Prophet of Allah did not borrow from anyone except that he returned more than what he borrowed. It

should be remembered that one should not desire for it. Whatever extra is received and without desire, is not interest.

One person said that Seyyed Ahmad Khan has written that double, (compound) interest is prohibited. He said, this is wrong that compound interest is prohibited and simple interest alone is allowed. Shariat does not mean this and this sentence is like 'keep doing sin upon sin.' It does not mean that one must commit sin. The kind of money received will be interest when the lender has the intention of getting interest. Otherwise, the benefits from the Government are not interest.

One person asked that a man who repents, what should he do of the property made out of bribery? He said, "Shariat's order is for repentance. So what belongs to whosoever should be returned. If he cannot trace him, he should give in charity. Bribery and gift must be distinguished. Bribery is that wealth that is withheld at the cost of other's interest. Otherwise, if someone has done our work with labor and has not transgressed other's rights then whatever is given to him will be his reward for his labor.

Question: What is your opinion about mortgage? He said, In my opinion, the mortgage when it is responsible for loss and profit is not prohibited.

Insurance etc., Interest and gambling excepted, other commitments and obligations are right in according with Shariat. Gambling has no obligation, worldly affairs

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carry one. One should remember in these matters that according to Quran one should not ask very very deep questions. For instance, if someone goes to a party and thinks that at one time illegal money must have come in their home then it would be impossible to attend such parties. God's name is *Sattar*. Otherwise, there are very few righteous people in the world. There are many indulged in the day-to-day dealings. It is written in the Quran: do not explore otherwise you will be in trouble. (Malfoozat, Vol. 5, pp. 221-223.)

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RAMAZAN THE MONTH OF FASTING

"O ye who believe! fasting is prescribed for you, as it was prescribed for those before you, so that you may guard against evil." (the Holy Quran 2:184)

This year the month of Ramazan the blessed month of the lunar year most probably will fall on July 25, 1979. We publish below the important regulations concerning the Fast, for the information of the members.

1. It is incumbent on every adult Muslim, man or woman, to fast in the month of Ramazan, except a sick person, or one who is on journey. A woman in her menstruation must not fast. But omission in these cases must be completed in other days. Aged people, those afflicted with disease of long standing who do not expect to be strong or well enough to be able to fast; or a woman whose suckling period and pregnancy alternate at such short and frequent intervals that she never has an occasion for years to fast, may pay Fidya - an expiation by feeding a man twice a day throughout Ramazan. One who is under above circumstances can also pay an amount of \$60 for the whole month as his/her Fidya i.e. expiation.

2. It was the Holy Prophet's practice to take a meal in the latter part of the night before beginning to fast. This meal is called "Sahoor". Observance of Sahoor though advised, is not an essential condition of fasting. Not having been able to take Sahoor meal, is not an excuse to omit a fast. Sahoor meal should preferably be taken immediately before it is time to begin the fast. It is against the instructions of the Holy Prophet (Peace and blessings of God be upon him) to take Sahoor meal at mid-night as is the custom among some of the Northerners.

3. Eating or drinking, or doing something unintentionally which otherwise break the fast or doing so not knowing that one is fasting, will not render the fast invalid. If however, the fast is broken, under the impression that it is time to break it, whereas the sun is yet above the horizon, such a fast will not be included in the count and will have to be made up by observing an extra fast after the Ramazan. 4. A fast lasts from early dawn till actual sunset. As soon the sun sets the fast must be broken and must not be delayed as is the wrong practice with some of the people. The following prayer can be recited while breaking the fast:- Allahumma Laka Somto Wa Beka Aamanto Wa Ala Rizqeka Aftarto - O, Lord I fasted for Thee and I believed in Thee and with Thy sustenance I broke my fast.

5. Eating, drinking, smoking, taking snuff or medicine, or an enema are all forbidden to a fasting man and so are sexual relations.

6. If a suckling woman or one with child is strong enough to fast without injuring the health of the child, she may fast. If she does not, she must fast in other days.

7. The Ramazan begins with the appearance of the moon and ends with the appearance of the moon of the next month, i.e. Shawwaal. If, however, the moon is not visible on account of clouds etc., Sha'ban which is the month previous to Ramazan should be allowed to run thirty days, and then the Ramazan fast should be begun. Similarly Ramazan should be allowed to run thirty days if there is no moon or if it is not visible on account of clouds etc., on the 29th. In this case Eid should be observed after completing thirty fasts.

8. A man who intentionally is breaking a fast of the Ramazan, or not fasting in Ramazan, without there being for him any excuse, is guilty of a great sin, and the penalty is 60 continuous fasts for every fast broken or committed, or if he is not capable of that, to feed 60 poor people.

9. The Muslim world is very particular in observing the "Taravih" prayer during Ramazan, which is the same as the ordinary "Tahajjad prayer." It is customary to recite

in this prayer the whole of the Holy Quran from beginning to end, in installments, during the thirty days of Ramazan. Reciters who know the Holy Book by heart lead the prayers and recite aloud for the benefit of the congregation. The practice of some of the Imams to recite the Holy Quran holding the Book in hands while leading the Taravih prayer is an innovation and is an undesirable act. The Taravih prayer is generally offered in eight "Rakats" made up of two at a time. The prayer is preferably offered in the latter part of the night. It may also be offered after Isha prayer and before the saying of Witar.

10. Pious Muslims also observe the concluding 10 days of the Ramazan as a period of special prayer, and remembrance of God. This period day and night, is spent in a Mosque in prayer and meditation and pious discourses — The people observing it go out only to answer calls of nature. This retirement is called *Itikaf*.

11. One must never fast when one is actually on the move on a journey, or on days when a journey is to begin or end. During the halts for complete days one may or may not fast. This rule applies only to the obligatory fast i.e., of the month of Ramazan. Omissions have to be made up later during other days.

Drivers or others whose profession is to travel for earning their livelihood cannot avail this facility and must fast while on the move.

12. Sadaqatul Fitr is obligatory upon each and every member of the family, so much so that even a child born on the last day of Ramazan is under its obligation and the father is bound to pay on his behalf.

THE HOLY QURAN ON FASTING

"O ye who believe! Fasting is prescribed for you, as it was prescribed for those before you, so that you may guard against evil.

"The prescribed fasting is for a fixed number of days, but whoso among you is sick or is on a journey shall fast the same number of other days; and for those who are able to fast only with great difficulty is an expiation – the feeding of a poor man. And whoso does good of his own accord it is better for him. And fasting is good for you, if you knew."

On beginning the Fast:

BE'ISMEKA ALLAHUMMA ASOOMO'

In Thy name, O lord, I fast.

On breaking the fast:

ALLAHUMMA LAKA SUMTO WA BEKA AAMANTO WA ALA RIZQEKA AFTARTO'

O our Lord! for Thy sake I observed the fast, and I put my trust in Thee, and I end this fast with the food Thou hast provided.

On finishing meals:

ALHAMDO LILLAHILLAZI AT'AMANA WA SAQAANA WA JA'ALANA MINAL MUSLEMEEN.

All praise belong to Allah Who provided us with food and drink and made us Muslims.

By the astounding Grace of Allah, Khuddam from all over USA, gathered on a small field called Camp Rabwah in Blairstown, New Jersey for the 1979 Ijtema Salana. Anxiety over unavailability of gasoline spurred Khuddam to greater sacrifices, and the attendance which approximately at optimum time about 170, was higher than previous Ijtemas! Alhamdulillah!

The Ijtema was opened by the Qaid-i-A'la Yahya Sharif with talawat by Sardar Rafiq Ahmad, Qaid Northeast, loud recitation of Pledge which is still ringing in the surrounding woods, roll call of Branches, raising of the Lawai Khuddamul-Ahmadiyya (flag) by Honor Branch Dayton 4B color party in their new black shirts, and Innaugaral address of the National Sadr Jama'at, Al-Haj Muzaffar Ahmad Zafr, the distinguished guest of honor.

Among the featured events were intensive competition between Khuddam in Talawat, Hadith competition, impromptu speeches, and volleyball. Each of the Zillas put forward a principal speaker with Abdul Kabir Haqque winning the first prize for Great Lakes Zilla, followed closely by Anwar Mahmud Khan, West Coast Zilla and Abu Bakr Ladd, Southeast Zilla.

Some of the Zilla teams added great spirit and color to the event by display of their Zilla colors in T-shirts during competitions.

Hassan M. Abdullah, and Abdus Salaam of Atlantic City and Khalil Aziz of Dayton worked very hard to provide the large number of Atfal with a full parallel program of competition and activity.

Seminar on Jesus' Death

Jamaat was blessed and honored to have as a part of our program the Mubaligh In Charge, Mir Mahmud Ahmad Nasir of Washington, D.C. Mubaligh of Mid-West Region Mian Muhammad Ibrahim, of Dayton Ohio. Mubaligh of East-Coast Region, Major Abdul Hamid New York and National President of U.S. Jamaats, Muzaffar Ahmad Zafr of Dayton, Ohio.

The Lecture was opened with a recitation from the Holy Quran by Bro. Muhammad Sadiq of New Jersey, and a poem by the Promised Messiah (peace be on him) recited by Imdad Ali, of Willingboro, N.J. Welcome address was presented by Hussain Abdul Aziz, President of Phila. Jamaat, and introduction to the Program, by Bilal Salaams, President of Phila. Ansarullah.

Mubaligh of East Coast Region, Major Abdul Hamid, gave a most inspiring speech on "The Message of Islam". He stated that we are living in a world of much sin and an abundance of crime. Every country is having problems of its own. Wars are in effect today.

He based his presentation on the standard books of the Promised Messiah.

Address To Lajna





Ahmadi's Boycott

Sir, I fully endorse the views expressed by Mr. Wadood Qamar regarding the grievances of Ahmadis with the Election Commission. In my opinion it is not justice with those who are proud of being Muslims to be bracketed with the non-Muslims. I am not an Ahmadi but I consider it wrong to compel them to fill separate forms for enrolement which are expressly meant for non-Muslims. As a realist-Muslim, I think it as intolerance to drive a sect who declares itself as Muslims to the fold of non-Muslim.

There are more than 72 sects within the existing Muslims of Pakistan. Their views are contradictory and even conflicting with each other and if the tussle of declaring one sect as *Kafir* by another is going on, then no one will remain a Muslim in Pakistan.

I request the Election Commission to solve the genuine demands of Ahmadis so that they may be enabled to end their boycott of enrolement as voters.

The Patriot, Harrisburg, Pa. May 25, 1979. Islamic Justice Effective Against Crime

While your comments on political actions of Khomeini in Iran, Idi Amin of Uganda and General Zia-ul-Haq of Pakistan (editorial May 21) may have some justification, your apparent criticism of Islam in general was pertubing and uncalled for. You led readers to believe that Islamic law of cutting off hands for stealing and beheading for major crimes in Saudi Arabia was brutal. How many one-handed people do you see in Saudi Arabia? None at all. During my two weeks stay there I did not come across any. On the contrary, for the same kind of crimes committed in so-called 'civilized' countries you will see scores of jails full with convicted thieves, and the crimes continue. The criminal is out after a few days in prison to strike again. If it was not for the lawmakers' fear of losing their own hands, the same law would have been here today.

Cutting off a hand for stealing is one of the Islamic laws. There are no overhead cameras in banks in Saudi Arabia, a jeweler would not have a steel door in his shop, he would just cover his showcase with a cloth to attend to the call for prayer in a nearby

Hamid A. Bhatti, Harrisburg Re-uniting with the Jamaat (A letter from Dr. M. Shafeek Sr.)

Assalamo Alaikum W.W.

Know the living, the dead, and the unborn. I, whose name emblazones this sheet of stationery, was asked by Brother M.M. Ibrahim, Missionary-in-Charge of the Dayton Mosque (Fazle-Omar Mosque) to state my reasons for my re-uniting with the Jamaat Ahmadiyya. The following in brief but sustained detail, are my reasons with Sweet Allah The Excellent as my Witness. For thirty-five years (35 years) I have been a practising Ahmadiyya Muslim. I signed Bai't at the hands of Beloved and Respected Khalifa Masih II, the Promised Son Of The Promised Messiah, (May The Peace And Blessings Of Allah Be Upon Both Of Them.) in March 25th, 1944 which was incidently my fourteenth Birthday (14th) I am now forty-eight (48). And through the years Ahmadiyyat has been a Marvelous Experience because in fee simple it is the absolute and unmitigated truth, without a tinge of unreasonableness, for It is The Religion Of Nature That Sweet Allah The Excellent Choose for us Himself; and under the fostering care and concern of Beloved Khalifa Masih II I gained so many Blessings and became so unshatterable in my convictions that I am feared to this day for the same. Moreover I grew to Love Khalifa -tul Masih II with a very great love that is alive now and will be until Allah calls me to reward. As we who follow Ahmadiyyat Islam know on November 8th 1965, a day of sadness for the whole of Mankind, Beloved Mahmud Khalifa Masih II was called to reward (Allah's Peace Be With Him) and his Eldest Son Hazrat Mirza Nasir Ahmad was elected Khalifatul Masih III on

November 9th, 1965. I established Bai't with Khalif Masih III (May Allah save him long) and things went well and although saddened by the Death of Mahmud Khalifa Masih II, I managed to restrain my grief. Shortly there after I had a problem that cropped up and kept me away from the Jamaat.

However, I point out in the stongest and most true terms that I have never ceased to be a faithful Ahmadiyya Muslim. After all I had my knowledge, and continued to add to it. Now comes the turning point that caused me to write Our Beloved and Present Khalifa, and reiterate my love and affection for him. I will add here for the record that I have always loved Our Present Khalifa, Hazrat Mirza Nasir Ahmad. I am the grandson of a Pure Irishman, a professional and highly decorated soldier of the U.S. Armed Forces, an American by Nationality, a Negro by birth and an Ahmadiyya Muslim by Faith and Choice in a Heathen Land. And for my entire life I have served Ahmadiyya Islam and will do so now.

A few weeks ago my eldest son Habeeb Muhammad Shafeek Jr., came to me and brought a Kodak Slide Projector and some memorex tapes and a tape recorder. Habeeb Muhammad Shafeek Jr. is the Eldest of my twelve Sons and Four Daughters. They are all adults but three. Habeeb Jr. said, "Father, I should like you to view these slides and if you will please listen to these tapes, they are of the Annual Gathering in Pakistan and I feel they will help you." I looked at my eldest son Habeeb Jr. like I had broke out of a cage, but I didn't say a word owing to the fact that he had been estranged from me for three years due to my fiery abrasions of times past, while

he was in fact trying all along to be a good Faithful Ahmadiyya Muslim. I viewed the slides with abject and resolute attention. Khalifatul Masih III came up on the projector and Habeeb Jr. played the tape of his sweet voice, some windbreakers dashed over my very soul, and as I pulled back on the affinity that I have with Beloved Mahmud, Khalifa Masih II, I began to transpose that affinity in share to Khalifa Masih III, as I pulled back upon the following Chapters in the Holy Quran that told of the Advent of the Promised Messiah (1:7: 25:56; and 73:16; and 61:7). The same confirms Hazrat Mirza Nasir Ahmad as Allah's Vicegerent on Earth, and The Reflection of The Holy Prophet Muhammad (On Whom be Peace and The Blessings of Allah). At that time I conceded by the Grace Of Sweet Allah The Excellent that Hazrat Mirza Nasir Ahmad is The Embodiment of Sweetness, and I was Converted to serve him when under the beauty of his own voice on the tape. I listened with a convulsed heart and tears streaming down my face as His Holiness narrated the evil design to take his life in Switzerland. Now at this point my blood boiled as the Irish, Indian and Negro anger rose in me for the truth is the truth I speak, I don't feel kindly towards anyone who wants to harm Our Beloved and Honored Khalifa. I wrote the Lord MirzaKhalifa Masih III and redeemed myself of harshness and stand ready to serve him till Allah takes him or me. As a matter of fact I am likened unto a seeker after death in the defense of My Khalifa, and I swear unto Allah in Whose Hands is our lives that I look forward to protecting The Lord Khalifa Masih III when he comes here, and for that matter

anywhere he needs me he has but to call. I will come and shan't flinch when I get there. As now my heart is filled with great love for Hazrat Khalifa Masih III.I would point out that an Honorable man takes responsibility for his action, it was my stubborness that prolonged this matter, as I said heretofore, the Khalifa is the embodiment of sweetness, and I love Him till Death. I am not an easy speaking Mamma raised boy, and I am no mellow mouthed man I acted in accordance with my nature, but Seeing How I Loved Ahmadiyyat, Sweet Allah The Excellent Changed my ire into great Love for Hazrat Mirza Nasir Ahmad, I Love His Whole Family and as I said before. I am a seeker after death in the service of Hazrat Mirza Nasir Ahmad. Please pray that all of my sons and daughters will become the Credit to Islam that their Elder Brother Habeeb Muhammad Shafeek Jr. is and please pray for me that Sweet Allah The Excellent will accept my contrition for harshness to His (Allah's) Vicegerent in the person of Khalifa Masih III and Please pray that I may serve Ahmadiyya Islam all the days of my life.

All the things I have said here are True With Allah As My Divine Witness.

THE HOLY QURAN ON RAMADHAN

The month of Ramadan is that in which the Quran was sent down as a guidance for mankind with clear proofs of guidance and discrimination. Therefore, whosoever of you is present at home in this month, let him fast therein. But whoso is sick or is on a journey, shall fast the same number of other days. Allah desires to give you facility and He desires not hardship for you, and that you may complete the number, and that you may exalt Allah for His having guided you and that you may be grateful.

And when My servants ask thee about Me, say: I am near. I answer the prayer of the supplicant when he prays to Me. So they should hearken to Me and believe in Me, that they may follow the right way.

It is made lawful for you to go in unto your wives on the night of the fast. They are a garment for you, and you are a garment for them. Allah knows that you have been acting unjustly to yourselves, wherefore He has turned to you with mercy and afforded you relief. So you may now go in unto them and seek what Allah has ordained for you; and eat and drink until the white thread becomes distinct to you from the black thread of the dawn. Then complete the fast until nightfall and do not go in unto them while you remain in the mosque for devotion. These are the limits fixed by Allah, so approach them not. Thus does Allah make His commandments clear to men that they may become secure against evil. (2:184-188)
