SUMMARY OF THE CONCLUDING ADDRESS OF HAZRAT KHALIFATUL MASIH III

(Delivered on May 10, 1979, to the participants of the 25th Annual Educational Class conducted by Majlis Khuddamul Ahmadiyya Central from April 27—May 10, 1979, at Rabwah, Pakistan.)

Hazrat Ameerul Momineen Hafiz Mirza Nasir Ahmad, Khalifatul Masih III, recited Tashahud, Ta'awwuz and Sura Fateha and then said:

The age in which we and you are born is the age of developments. These developments are of two kinds and they have divided mankind into two parts. There are worldly developments which have brought revolutionary changes in the lives of men. In this context Hazrat Khalifatul Masih described somewhat in detail the scientific progress, the day-to-day inventions and their effects on human life. He particularly pointed out man's landing on the moon and his efforts to reach stars and planets.

Afterwards, Khalifatul Masih, referring to the extraordinary means provided for spiritual progress in this very age, remarked that the revolutionary changes which have resulted all over the world due to the material developments are proving helpful in the propagation of Islam. The invention of printing press has produced mass publication of books. The invention of telephone, telegraph, telex, radio and television has facilitated the works regarding the spread of Islam. God the Exalted wishes that man who in his efforts to reach the moon and the stars has been concerned to

find out the reality of the first heaven, should achieve the spiritual progress by accepting Islam and thus soaring high in spiritual firmament should reach the seventh heaven. In the early days there had been thousands of Muslims who, through the complete obedience of the Holy Prophet (peace and blessings of God be on him), reached the seventh heaven and even caused others to become the soaring birds of spiritual heaven.

Now God the Exalted has entrusted the responsibility of this memorable work on our and your shoulders to carry it out on a universal level. He desires to establish such a graceful society on the entire surface of the earth as may end human sufferings and troubles, and provide mankind with such spiritual pleasures and welfare that they may enjoy the heavenly life in this very world, and paradise may be their resort in the next world. This is called Islamic society. It is the task of you Ahmadiyya youth, Khalifatul Masih exhorted the participants, to establish this kind of society. You have to prove to the people of the world through your practical example that the life they are passing at this time is far lesser and despicable than to the life which, acting upon the teachings of Islam, they can pass in an Islamic society.

In this context, Khalifatul Masih explained some of those morals and qualities on which the foundation of Islamic society is determined. He particularly elucidated in detail the Islamic teachings and their subtleties and wisdom regarding truthfulness, equity and justice, fulfilment of promise, respect for the feelings of others, abstinence from circulation of others defects, shunning from backbiting, and observing honesty and trust. He also elaborated the grace of the society which is established through these morals.

Islamic society is such a graceful society, Khalifatul Masih continued, that if you could mould yourselves into an embodiment of practical example of Islamic teachings, and thus succeed in showing to others the glimpse of Islamic society in your lives, then the people of the world themselves effected by it would be automatically drawn towards Islam and its graceful society.

Addressing the students in particular, Khalifatul Masih said: Do not think yourselves mere children; rather consider yourselves as the ones who have to bring the world towards Islam and have to establish the Islamic society in the entire world by presenting practical example of everlasting and unparalleled teachings of Islam. May Allah enable us to witness in our lives the establishment of that graceful Islamic society on the surface of the earth which may turn this world into paradise and mankind may inherit paradise in the next world too. PRONOUNCEMENTS OF THE PROMISED MESSIAH ON TRAVEL

A man submitted a written question that he had to travel to and fro to about 10-15 miles and whether it should be considered travel and what should be done for prayers? Hazrat-i-Aqdas said, "My religion is that one should not overburden oneself. Travel, even if it is for three miles, should be considered in terms of travel and prayer reduction. Often with friends we travel 2-3

miles for a walk but nobody thinks it is travel. However, when one starts with an intent for travel, he becomes a traveller. Shariat is not based on time and travel as commonly understood should be taken intrinsically. And as you follow the orders of God, in a similar way follow His sanctions. Obligations are from God and sanctions are also from God. (Feb. 14, 1901)

PROCLAMATION ON THE ADVENT OF MUSLEH-E-MAUD GOD IS SPEAKING THROUGH MY TONGUE

(Excerpts from a speech of Hazrat Musleh-e-Maud, delivered at Lahore on March 1, 1944, to thousands of people of all faiths and denominations.)

"Today I swear before this congregation, as falsely swearing in the name of God is of the condemned, and whosoever flouts God cannot escape His wrath, that God has informed me in this city of Lahore at 13 Temple Road at the house of Sheikh Bashir Ahmad Advocate, that I am the culminator of the prophecy of Musleh-e-Maud and that I am the Musleh-e-Maud through whom Islam will reach to the corners of the earth and the Unity of God shall be established.

God has given me those swords which will cut the unbelief in a moment. God has given me those hearts who are ready for sacrifice at my voice. If I ask them to jump into the ocean they will jump into the ocean. If I ask them to drop themselves in ovens they will burn themselves in ovens. If suicide was not forbidden, if suicide was not illegal in Islam, then I could have shown you an instance that one hundred men of Jamaat were ordered by me to commit suicide by putting a dagger in their stomachs and they would have died by the dagger. God has raised us for the support of Islam. God has raised us to raise the name of the Prophet of God.

O people of Lahore, I give unto you the message of God. I call you to that eternal

God who has created you all. Do not think that I am speaking of my own. At this moment I am not speaking, istead God is speaking through my tongue. In opposition to me, whosoever raises a voice against Islam his voice will be curbed. But God will establish a majestic foundation for the support and progress of Islam through me. I am a human being. I can die today and I may die tomorrow. But it can never happen that I fail in my purpose for which God has raised me. If the world at any time witnesses that Islam has been conquered, if the world ever sees that my believers were overpowered by those who did not believe in me, then undoubtedly take me as a liar. But if the news came out true then think yourself what would be your end that your heard God's voice through my tongue but even then did not accept it."

[This speech which was also heard by the Editor, left such indelible marks that will be remembered for long. To thousands of men reached the words from Hazrat Musleh-e-Maud, "At this moment I am not speaking, it is God who is speaking through my tongue". Each and every word of this remarkable speech touched the hearts. W~are witness to it.—Ed]

GREAT LAKES REGIONAL LAJNA IMAILLAH

The Great Lakes Regional Lajna Imaillah of the Ahmadiyya Movement in Islam held its first regional conference for women on April 7, 1979, in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

Approximately 1000 letters of invitation with pre-registration forms were mailed to women in Racine, Milwaukee, and Kenosha, Wis.; and Chicago and Waukegan, Illinois. This included letters to women's civic and religious groups, family members of Ahmadis, friends, and also other Lajnas. Many letters were posted in public buildings and passed out by hand. Press releases went out to all the media. The subsequent media coverage was tremendous, Alhumdulillah.

Radio response was most extensive: WLUM-FM, a Milwaukee station, broadcasted a 30-minute interview on Sunday, April 1. Sisters Nusrat Jahan Bashir, national vice president, and Fatimah Nur Jawad, Great Lakes regional president, participated in the interview which was conducted by a.

member of the WLUM staff (a Holy Quran was presented to this young lady after the taping of the interview). The in-depth interview gave the opportunity to present to the public information regarding the Ahmadiyya Movement, the Promised Messiah (PBOH), Lajna Imaillah, and the conference, Alhumdulillah. Another Milwaukee radio station permitted us air time in which to present the message in a short telephone interview.

TV coverage: Milwaukee television channel WITI-6 carried a live six-minute interview during their News at Noon program with Sis. Fatimah Nur Jawad on Friday, March 30. The interview was conducted by a station staff member, and the interview contained information about Ahmadiyyat and the regional conference. Moreover, Channel 6 has committed itself to devote a portion of a late April or early May edition of their People to People talk show to Ahmadiyyat with several Jama'at members being interviewed. Additional coverage was obtained by means of an ad regarding the conference during a commercial break in one of their popular early morning programs, A New Day, by TV4, WTMJ. Announcement of the conference was as reported, made on the local PBS station, WMVS-10, also.

Newspaper coverage included a listing of the conference in the "Community Happenings" section of the Milwaukee Community Journal. A two-column article was run, unedited, in the April issue of the University of Wisconsin—Milwaukee student newspaper Invictus.

Sisters from three states, including the national president of the U.S. Lajna, Sis. Rasheeda Saeed, attended the conference. Approximately 30 non-Muslim guests attended also. Members of other Muslim groups attended too.

The format of the conference was as follows: Five 10-minute lectures were presented. After the lectures were completed, members of the audience asked questions of the panel members, on Islam and Ahmadiyyat.

The visual display for the conference was centered around a large poster picture of the Promised Messiah (PBOH). This picture was specifically called to the attention of the audience. Free literature and materials for sale were provided for all attendees. The material for purchase included Holy Qurans and the booklets What is Ahmadiyyat, Muhammad in the Bible, and Treasures of Al-Fatiha. The guests took advantage of the display, Alhumdulillah, by taking much of the free literature and purchasing some of the items that were for sale including copies of the Holy Ouran. Additionally, each guest was given a formal printed program by a member of the reception committee. The program included the message of the Promised Messiah and a list of the topics to be discussed along with the names of the panel members. The program included an evaluation sheet which facilitated audience feedback on the conference. The general opinion of the non-Ahmadi guests expressed via the evaluation form as well as vocally, was that the "next" conference should be longer.

The Conference entitled 'Invitation to Success', directed toward women and the importance of their role in the survival of mankind, was, by Allah's Grace, to say the least, a tremendous success.

HOW ENGLAND WAS LOST TO ISLAM?

Had powerful Moorish ruler Emir Mohammed Al-Nassir overlooked the fact that Islam forbids taking undue advantage of helpless people, England would have become a Muslim country in the 13th century – some 800 years ago.

Gabriel Ronay in his book "The Tarter Khan's Englishman" published by Cassel, disclosed that in 1213 King John of England sent a secret emissary of three persons to Moorish ruler Emir Mohammed Al-Nassir with offer of homage and promise that if England were to be received into the Arab fold King John would become the Emir's tribute-paying vassal and he along with his subjects convert to Islam.

Ronay came across verbatim account of secret emissary while researching for book on Robert Dad, London Catholic priest who was also one of the emissary sent to Al-Nassir and who was later ex-communicated and banished from England by King John for his role in the Magna Carta rebellion of 1215.

This forgotten episode of English history when King John offered to become Muslim along with his subjects was dutifully recorded by Saint Alban's chronicler of 13th century, Mathew Paris. There is little to question veracity of his account writes Ronay, because he heard it straight from those emissaries.

Nassir's Rebuff: Baron Thomas Har-

dington, head of King John's emissary, according to Paris accounts, was instructed by John to tell Emir Al-Nassir "great King of Africa, Morocco and Spain that he would voluntarily give up to him, himself and his kingdom, and if he pleased, would hold it as tributary for him and that he would also abandon Christian faith which he considered false and would faithfully adhere to law of Mohammed".

Baron Hardinton, who was accompanied by Baron Relph Fitznicholar and Catholic priest Master Robert de London handed King John's letter to the Emir and with the aid of an interpreter proceeded to convey with oratorial skill the richness of England's soil, fertility of its fields and skill of its people "who are handsome and ingenious, are skilled in three languages, Latin, French and English as well as in every liberal and mechanical pursuit".

Ronay describes Emir's reply as "exceptionally level headed" when he said, "I have never read or heard that any king possessing such prosperous kingdom, subject and obedient to him, would thus voluntarily ruin his sovereignty by making tributary to a country that is free by giving to a stranger that which is his own by turning happiness to misery and thus giving himself up to will of another conquerred as it were without wound".

Upon his emissary's return to England,

King John "wept bitterly in being baulked in his purpose".

Catholic priest, Master Robert de London later was excommunicated and banished from England as a result of his role in the Magna Carta rebellion. He went to Mongolia to become Tartar Khan's chief diplomat and later to return to Europe eventually as head of the Tartars that converted nearly half of Europe to Islam.

SHROUD TEST RESULTS 'DRAMATI-CALLY AFFIRMING'

American scientists who examined the ancient Shroud of Turin which supposedly wrapped Christ's body have not yet drawn final conclusions about it, but they say preliminary findings tend to validate it.

"All the evidence to date supports authencity," says computer analyst Kenneth Stevenson of New Orleans, designated official spokesman for the team of about 30 scien-

tists in various specialties.

"At this point, in my opinion, it would be more of a miracle if it proves to be a hoax than if it proves to be genuine."

The team spent two weeks in Turin, Italy, last fall, running all sorts of the latest scientific tests on the cloth with its puzzling image of a man wounded in the way the Bible says Christ was.

The scientists regard their raw data as the most thorough ever amassed on the shroud, using the latest techniques.

However, with work going on at a half dozen different laboratories and institutes, some partial findings already have emerged, some of them considered of a dramatically affirming nature.

"I haven't seen anything yet that would lead one to think the shroud is not real," says chemist Robert Dinegar of the Los Alomos Scientific Laboratory in New Mexico. "I think the burden of proof is being pushed on the skeptics. (Jackson Citizen Patriot, Sunday, May 6, 1979.)

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
