FRIDAY SERMON

by Hazrat Khalifatul Masih IV

(English rendering by Anwar Ahmad Kahton)

Delivered at Fazal Mosque, London on December 7, 1984

After Shahadat, and seeking protection and recitation of Fatehah, he recited the following verse from the Holy Ouran:

Say to the People of the Book: Let us agree upon the matter which is the same for you and for us, namely, that we worship none but Allah, and that we associate no partner with Him, and that some of us take not others for lords beside Allah. Then, if they turn away, say to them: Bear ve witness that we have submitted to Allah (3:65).

An Invitation to the People of the Book

Then he proceeded: This is the invitation that was extended to the People of the Book in the shape of a common "Kalima". This is only a part of the Kalima Tayyaba that was revealed to Muhammad

centrating on items that generate hatred, the need is to meet on "common ground" which, despite differences, do exist among various people. Through this means, bonds of love can be created. This is the spirit of the verse in the light of which, Hazrat Muhammad Mustapha, peace be on him, extended an invitation to the People of the Book, although they did not believe in him. The invitation was extended to those who took pride in considering him an impostor and who left no stone unturned in their enmity towards him and his followers. They spread hatred and wrote satires, which they broadcast throughout Arabia. They made false and filthy accusation against him. They called him a sorcerer or a magician and sometimes described him as a person under an evil spell who had lost his sense of

balance. On occasion, they called him a lover or a poet who had become insane. Often, they deliberately distorted his name and inflicted as much injury on his body and on his character as they possibly could. It is impossible to conceive of any kind of injury that they did not attempt to inflict on him. In these circumstances, apparently there is no room at all for any co-operation. It would seem that the two people had split for ever and there was no chance left for their joining hands. Under these conditions, when hatred was at its height, our Lord and master, Hazrat Muhammad Mustapha, peace be on him, imparted such a noble lesson to the peoples of this world. He said: O People of the Book, let us agree on one matter, which is the same for you and for us. You may falsify us, but this part of the belief is Continued on page 3

common between us and therefore if you claim to love God, then come and co-operate with us, and jointly we shall proclaim that in future we shall never worship anyone other than Allah. This was, of course, only half the Kalima Tayyaba. Nevertheless the Holy Prophet of Islam extended this invitation knowing well that they disbelieved the second part of the Kalima Tayyuaba, i.e., Muhammad is the Messenger of Allah. It was with that background that they had dealt with him with such great severity. In spite of that, forgetting the hatred and enmity shown towards him, Hazrat Muhmmad Mustapha, peace be on him, invited the People of the Book to the "common platform."

The people that I address today believe in both parts of the Kalima Tayyaba. They believe that there is no god worthy of being worshipped except Allah, and they also believe that Muhammad, peace be on him, is His servant and His Messenger. Though they have faith in both parts of the Kalima, instead of displaying love, they are sowing the seeds of enmity and are spreading hatred, while they claim to be the servants of Muhammad Mustapha, peace be on him. They also claim to love Allah, and yet, in an oblique way, they display hatred towards both the first and second parts of the Kalima. Is it not strange that when they see Kalima inscribed on the walls and entrances, in the Mosques, on the arches, and on the pulpits of Ahmadi Mosques, they claim their hearts begin to overflow with indignation and wrath? Are we not passing through a very strange episode?

Kalima - Defined

What is Kalima? It connotes a meeting point of the Divine and His perfect slaves. Kalima is manifestation of the great eminence of Hazrat Muhammad Mustapha, peace be on him, that brought God and man together. Beyond that point, a meeting is unimaginable. Kalima is a light that illuminates its surroundings and it is a talisman that imparts life to dying hearts and that bestows eternal life to the living who become immune from spiritual death. It is the Kalima that has illuminated the heavens and the earth. It is the very same Kalima that became the rationale for the creation of Pakistan. It is on the basis of this Kalima that when the creation of Pakistan was in doubt, Sunnis, Shias, Brelvis, non-Brelvis and Ahmadis fused themselves into one body for its protection. For the sake of this Kalima and for the establishment of a home, with all their heart and soul, they became engaged in a struggle for the achievement of this goal. In the front row, prominent amongst other defenders of the Kalima, Ahmadis also participated. Hundreds of thousands of lives were lost in this struggle. So much blood was shed that it could have tinted the waters of all the rivers. Innumerable children became orphans and innumerable women became widows, but the Muslim nation did not fail to defend the Kalima of Unity of Allah. It was through the blessings of the Kalima that the Unity of Allah descended from the heavens to the earth and throughout the sub-continent all Muslims became like one body. The creation of Pakistan undoubtedly was due to this Kalima. Those Ulema who, in the name of Islam, used abusive language for Pakistan, found that the platforms which they considered firm and stable, were in fact formed of quicksand. Consequently, the entire Muslim nation, in the name of the Kalima, rallied around the Qaid-e-Azam. The martyrs, who laid down their lives for their country, could hardly have imagined that an unfortunate episode was to follow when in the name of Islam, the employes of the Government whether Magistrates or Policemen, holding pails of black paint in their hands, shouting slogans, would proceed to delete the Kalima with their own hands. They would claim that they could not rest until they delete the Kalima, demolish the domes of our mosques and change the direction of our Qibla. Alas! Pakistan was to witness such an unfortunate episode. What I am telling you is not just imagination. Such slogans have in fact been raised in Deobandi mosques and gatherings elsewhere, even in private meetings. They claim that these slogans would capture the hearts of the common folk, and through such slogans they would eradicate what they belive to be falsehood. The question is, what is it that they believe to be false? Is it: I bear witness that there is no one worthy of worship except Allah, and I bear witness that Muhammad, peace be on him, is His servant and Messenger? Apparently, in their view, this is falsehood and they are mounting a campaign to eradicate this imaginary falsehood. They claim that they will sacrifice all and will leave their homes, determined to achieve their objective and to make the ultimate sacrifice will carry their shrouds wrapped over their heads and that no power on earth can resist them or stop their progress. They claim that they will murder and assassinate Ahmadis and

rivers of blood will flow in the streets of Pakistan, and that they will change the direction of our mosques and Qibla and the Kalima will be deleted. They announce that the domes which suggest the existence of mosques and proclaim the Unity of Allah, will be demolished. This change, which has occurred for the first time in the history of mankind, was beyond anyone's imagination.

Kalima and Qibla - Significance

Even at a time of such extreme crisis and danger, when Hazrat Abu Bakr Siddique, may Allah be pleased with him, while he was engaged in suppressing the apostates and rebels, and when, with most evil designs a dangerous rebellion in Arabia had come to the surface that had generated such spirit amongst the various tribes that horde after horde surrounded Medina with a view to eradicating Islam, instructed those who took part in defense thus: If Allah grants you success and He surely will make you victorious, then you are not to touch anyone who prays facing the Qibla of Hazrat Muhammad Mustapha, peace be on him, or offers Nimazafter our style, or pays Zakat. How strange is it that today referring to the same Hazrat Abu Bakr Siddique, may Allah be pleased with him, it is being announced that unless we change our Qibla, unless we give up offering Nimaz as was taught by Hazrat Muhammad Mustapha, peace be on him, and unless we give up paying Zakat, our throats, for daring to pray facing the Qibla, would be cut.

When a people lose their sense of balance and become insane, they can do anything. Here is a reference to them in this verse:

They do not ponder over the verses of the Holy Quran and therefore their hearts are incapable of rational thoughts. It is through such a phase that unfortunate Pakistan is passing through. A group of Ulema, under the protection and patronage of the Government is responsible for oppressive and unjust acts, and there is no one around who would ask them to desist and to see reason and to tell them that they themselves must not create conditions that would result in their own destruction. Little do they realise that Divine destiny always destroys those who attempt to delete Kalima. Instead of pondering over this question or attempting to understand the import of the warnings, they keep on progressing in their audaeity. Their slogans are also becoming progressively unjust and cruel and bear no relationship whatsoever with Islam. They do not even seem to be concerned with the prestige of their masters who employ them.

Trick and Treat

Some Deobandi Ulema who are now in the forefront of the movement to delete the Kalima, in their own private meetings, amongst friends, with great pride say: How can Ahmadis survive when the Ministry of Religious Affairs is backing us? Even when we are in gaol, we are in contact with the Ministers by telephone. They convey messages to us and, in our absence, act like our assistants. How can the Ahmadis stand up to us when the entire Government machinery is in our support? In their arrogance and pride, they forget that this way they are defaming their own patrons. They are defaming a Government that claims, through its agencies, all over the world, that they have no connection with such a movement and they are being forced to take some action to defuse the agitation launched by the Mullahs. Against that very Government, such people make these claims and it is becoming apparent for all to see what is behind the drama that is being staged. They themselves spread such incredible tales. Allah knows best to what extent there is truth in what they say.

It does, however, make one wonder. They even claim that the Ministry of Religious Affairs has permitted them, if necessary, to defame the Government and to threaten that if Zia or the Governor does not accept their demands, they shall shed blood which will flow like rivers. This is being done so that the Government may have an excuse to do what they wish to, i.e. promulgate further Ordinances that would make the writing of Kalima a great offence. The agitators therefore openly claim that the Police dare not stop them as the Government itself had asked them to abuse them so that independent observers may believe that the Government has no hand in this movement. On the one hand, the Government is fearful of being defamed and humiliated in the eyes of the world that they are prepared to be abused in their own country. On the other hand, these workers are so unfortunate and shameless that they are destroying the respect of those very people who, for their sake have become targets of their abuse. While they abuse, they unknowingly

expose a conspiracy protecting and manoeuvering them, and that they are behaving in a manner directed from above. Besides defaming their own Government, unfortunately they are also attempting to defame the Government of Saudi Arabia. Pakistan, in spite of full knowledge of what is going on, permits these moves. Insofar as Saudi Arabian Government is concerned, I cannot even remotely imagine that they would be participants in a conspiracy to delete the Kalima of Unity of God. When Khana Ka'aba seemed surrounded by paganism and in Khana Ka'aba itself, some acts could be witnessed which did not have the remotest connection with Islam, one of the ancestors of the rulers of Saudi Arabia, Maulana Abdul Wahab, rendered great and invaluable service to Islam and frustrated the efforts of the pagans. The movement spread and in a short time enveloped the whole of Arabia. The voice that was first raised in Hijaz then spread in the neighbouring territories. It is through the blessings of the Kalima of Unity that the present rulers have been blessed with enormous wealth. Even casual thought would make it clear beyond any shadow of doubt that this prestige has emanated from the blessings of the Kalima of Unity. Had they not launched a campaign for the protection of the doctrine of Unity of Allah, it would not have been possible for them to capture Hijaz and become the guardians of Khana Ka'aba. It is in this region that today we see wells belching oil.

They are openly claiming that even if they do not enjoy the support of their own Government, since Saudi Arabia provides much needed finance, Pakistan is necessarily obligated to accept guidance from Saudi Arabia. Therefore, it is argued, that the Government of Pakistan dare not resist their demands. They go so far as to say that they have a direct link with the Minister for Religious Affairs and that Zia or some generals, even if they wish to, dare not reject their demands. The real axis that has been established between us and the Ministry of Religious Affairs, they claim, has a direct connection with Saudi Arabia. Saudi Arabia, in turn, it is argued, is backed by America. Therefore, the Government of Pakistan dare not resist. This way, they are also defaming the Saudi Arabian Government.

Kalima and Divine Favours

Allah the Almighty, Who is very jealous in the matter of the unity of Allah, as a reward for their having staked all for the sake of the Kalima of

Unity, blessed them with immeasurable wealth. How can we, therefore, believe that the Royal Family of Saudi Arabia, who got established because of the Unity of Allah and, due to the struggle which they waged, have been recipients of great Divine favours, would become so insane as to join in any conspiracy to delete the Kalima of Unity? This is impossible. We know the Mullhas of Pakistan. They are liars. We have had experience. At least we are fully familiar with the conduct of Deobandi Maulvis. Without the slightest hesitation, they keep on lying. Whoever has read the Munir Inquiry Report will have a true insight into their character. You may study the Report. Neither Mr. Justice Munie, nor Mr. Justice Kyani were Ahmadis. But they were both Judges of great eminence. Stories of the justice which they dispensed with courage are famous throughout the world. Fearlessly and with great courage, they wrote: These people can be bought. They have been tools in the hands of the powers that opposed Pakistan. Whenever they were financed by the opponents of Pakistan against the interest of Pakistan, without hesitation, they obeyed the dictates. These are the people who claimed to be the victors in the matter of the Shaheed Ganj Mosque. Unfortunately, people of Pakistan seem to have a short memory. Their memory is so weak that they keep on for getting even relatively recent events. The memory of Ahmadis is however not weak. On no account therefore are they willing to believe that in the matter of deletion of the Kalima of Unity, Saudi Arabia is a participant in the conspiracy. They lie and it would appear that they lie to the Saudis as well. Obviously, they convey distorted versions of events and due to their simplicity and lack of intimate knowledge it is quite possible that they give them some money. I do not deny that, as we know that wherever in the world they feel that the cause of Islam is being served, they are willing to provide the necessary finance. Saudi Arabia has financed projects even in Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Indonesia and Bangladesh. Their finances in this cause reach the corners of the earth and also cover the African countries. Wherever any Muslim organization embarks on any project to serve the cause of Islam and if the Saudis Government is satisfied in this regard, without a doubt, they donate most generously.

However, we cannot believe that the standard bearers of Unity of Allah who themselves are recipients of blessings of Unity of Allah, from the wealth

that they have received as a reward for their struggle in the cause would themselves become participants in a movement to delete the Kalima of Unity. This is beyond the realm of possibility. There is undoubted deceit. It is, however, necessary that the whole world be made aware of what is happening in Pakistan. Surely, this is a satanic move to delete Pakistan from the map of the world. However weak the Muslims may be, surely they can comprehend that Allah can never permit a conspiracy to delete the Kalima of Unity. Any country that joins in this conspiracy will be pulverized, but Allah will not permit Kalima of Unity to suffer. Little does the man in the street realise that an attack on the Kalima is an attack on the Unity of Allah, which in turn endangers the country where the plot is hatched. One can see some most troublesome times ahead for this unfortunate country in which such occurances are permitted and in which no effective voice is being raised against such moves.

The Divine Destiny

The truth is, that neither they themselves, nor their leaders, nor their masters are aware that the destiny of Allah is in motion though unseen. They cannot even comprehend that Divine destiny is at work. Never in any anti-Ahmadiyya movement had, what I am about to tell you, happened before. Now, quite openly, from some mosques, and amongst the intelligentsia, and in various places, it is being said that Ahmadis are in the right and that those who wish to destroy them are in the wrong. In their ignorance, they have taken this step. This has become apparent. It will soon be known whose faith is pure and whose Ka'aba is "Teerath," or is "Hardawar."

In the past, some Islamic armies marched to destroy "Soamanto" and to write in prominent and brilliant paint the Kalima of Unity over temples, hills, valleys and cliffs of Northern India. Currently, we are witnessing some "Soamanti" powers, that paradoxically in the name of Islam, are attacking the Kalima. However ignorant the people may be, they are not completley blind. According to news recently received from Pakistan, it appears that a movement is afoot that is gaining strength day by day. Although the ignorant do not feel their presence yet, but we can see ripples on the surface.

Irony of Fate

It is a queer irony of fate. Brelvis who, it was said, had no connection with Islam, and were pundits of

Benaras and were being portrayed as idolators and worshippers of graves, while Deobandis were presented as protectors of the Kalima of Unity. Destiny has played a strange trick with the Deobandis, as they are the ones now attempting to delete the Kalima of Unity and Brelvis, from their pulpits are cursing them for this act. They say: However misguided the Ahmadis may be, it is a fact that they have faith in the Kalima of Unity and they are laying down their lives for the sake of the Kalima of Unity. Therefore, we are not prepared to count the Deobandi dead amongst martyrs. On the other hand, those who die in preventing the deletion of the Kalima, are in our view, martyrs. I can see this movement progressing. There may be some weaknesses among Brelvis, but without a doubt they love Allah and Muhammad, peace and blessings of Allah be upon him. They may stretch their imagination or magnify or exaggerate, but one often sees that unbridled love results in distortion of facts and exaggeration. Nevertheless the exaggeration is in the matter of love and not hatred.

Unfortunately, the Wahabis and Deobandis in the matter of Kalima of Unity have indulged in exaggeraiton to such an extent that they have deprived themselves of the true love of Hazrat Muhammad Mustapha, peace be on him, and consequently of the Divine Light. Their hearts are like empty nests where live birds do not flutter any longer. Had there been a slight ray of light in their hearts, they would have preferred to die rather then proclaim that they would willy nilly delete the Kalima, and alter the Qibla, etc, etc.

The Brelvis may indulge in exaggeration. In certain respects they may be misguided. The exaggeration is in the matter of love. Their love for Hazrat Muhammad Mustapha, peace be on him, and their opposition to Ahmadiyyat. It is true that they have been our opponents and they do not wish to see us prosper. Nevertheless, the overpowering love of Allah and His Prophet has substantially reduced their hated and they are beginning to proclaim that those who wish to delete the Kalima are in the wrong. They say that even if they hear of the Kalima from an infidel, they would be pleased as the name of their beloved Prohpet and the Unity of God would thus be proclaimed. Even if an idolator makes such a proclamation, it would delight their hearts, and they may say: Lo! The proclamation of the Unity of Allah is emanating even from the idola-

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tors. This movement is taking root and is spreading.

Steps to Destruction

The Government is not aware as to what is going on and how the Divine destiny is at work and what will be their fate. Nor do these unfortunate ones realise that those who for the sake of financial assistance, pretend to be standard bearers of the Unity of Allah are in fact taking steps for its destruction. In the name of Muhammad Mustapha, peace be on him, they do not hesitate to delete the name of Muhammad Mustapha, peace be on him. It is feared that Pakistan may witness some fearful and turbulent days. Anyhow, I appeal to the common people of Pakistan, may they be Brelvis, Deobandis, Shias, or members of any other sect: You must not get directly involved in the conspiracy. The common people are simple Muslims, whether they be Brelvis, Deobandis, Wahabis, or members of any other sect. In their faith, Kalima has an extraordinarily prominent position. They may be poor, but in their rags, the Kalima is sparkling like a diamond. This is the most valuable of all their possessions for which they have immense love. Reminding them of their love for the Kalima of Unity, I wish to say to them: Rise and beware and oppose every move to delete the Kalima. Oppose and beware and be active. If you do not make a move now, then, by God, Allah's destiny will begin to move against you. It may even deface any country that is determined to delete the Kalima. If the Kalima was strong enough to cause creation of a country, surely it will-prevail even if the entire country combines to delete it. The country which itself was a creation of the Kalima may get destroyed. May Allah save us from such a misfortune and may He grant wisdom to the Pakistanis, open their eyes so that they may act rationally and they may realise where they come from and where they are headed.

Kalima - Our Dearest Heritage

In his supplementary Sermon, he said: Today's Khutba was primarily addressed collectively to the Pakistani nation and it did not contain any separate message for the Ahmadis. But I know, and so does every Ahmadi, that there is no need for a separate message. I did not feel the necessity as I know well that an Ahmadi cannot be separated from the Kalima whatever price he may have to pay. He may lose his life, but an Ahamdi will never forsake the Kalima, nor will the Kalima ever forsake an

Ahmadi. His spirit may depart from his physical body, but will rise duly accompanied by the Kalima. To cut off his spirit from the Kalima is an impossibility. His jugular vein can be cut, but he cannot be separated from his love of the Kalima. The current position of the Ahmadis can be compared with the occasion when Hazrat Muhammad Mustapha, peace be on him, was in great physical danger. At that time, unconsciously and impulsively, the Ansars said: O the Prophet of Allah, we shall fight in front of you, behind you, to your right, to your left, and by God, the enemy will not be able to approach you unless he tramples underfoot our dead bodies. Today, the physical body of Hazrat Muhammad Mustapha, peace be on him, is not amongst us, but we have with us a pious and pure Sign, which is dearer to us than our hearts and souls, i.e., the Kalima which combines in it the Unity of Almighty God and Prophethood of Muhammad Mustapha, peace be on him. This is our dearest and most valuable heritage. Addressing Hazrat Muhammad Mustapha, peace be on him, with great determination we say: O the pious and exalted Messenger of Allah. You are dearer to us than the dearest. By God, we shall not permit the opponents to approach the pure sign that you have given us. To protect it, we shall fight in front of it, behind it, to its right and to its left. The wicked opponents will never reach the Sign unless they trample underfoot our dead bodies. This is the voice that rises from every Ahamdi heart. As I had not made a direct reference to them, I thought that in the Supplementary Khutba, I should say these words. Ahmadis must not feel that I have addressed others, but have not brought into motion their innermost sentiments. Their sentiments are not capable of being translated into words, but they can rest assured, these are being conveyed to Allah, the Exalted, Who will value them. Be perpared for every sacrifice. There is no cause for concern. We cannot recede even a step, as behind us is the mountain of the Kalima, which is protecting our rear. Consequently, we may advance, but there will never be any need to retreat. On the altar of the Kalima, we are prepared to sacrifice all that we have. The enemy may test us in any way that he likes. He will not find any Ahmadi a coward, or weak.

Another young Ahmadi martyred.

It is with profound sorrow to inform you that another young Ahmadi aged 18 years has been martyred in a busy Jehlum street.

On 28.11.1984 at about 6. pm. the young Ahmadi Rana Sultan Mahmood was walking along the street when an arch enemy of Ahmadiyyat shot him in the back of the neck in the presence of several persons. He died on the spot.

Since the promulgation of the Ordinance the assailant continuously used insulting and abusive language and behavior towards Ahmadiyyat. He also had row with the deceased and about a fornight before this incident he tried to forcibly take away Rana Sultan Mahmood's motor cycle but was prevented to do so.

About half an hour before the incident, the assailant quarelled with the deceased but some members of the public intervened and the matter was resolved amicably. The assailant who is a brother of the Chairman of the Jehlum City Council, then left but shortly afterwards he came back and suddently shot the deceased through the back of his neck. The deceased died on the spot. All the eye witnesses, who are non-Ahmadis, have come forward and given evidence against the accused. In view of the fact that the deceased is an Ahmadi, it all depends how the situation develops further. The general public of Jehlum have condemned this brutal and cold blooded murder.

Islam, an Arabic word meaning "submission to Allah (God)," is based on the revelations of Allah to Mohammed, who was born in Mecca (now in Saudi Arabia) and who lived from about A.D. 570 to 632. Among Muslims, Mohammed is believed to have been a descendant of Abraham, the founder of Judaism.

Mohammed received the revelations of Allah compiled in the Koran, and provided explanations of Koranic teachings in the Sunna.

The main Islamic article of faith is a simple one: "There is no god but God (Allah), and Mohammed is His messenger." In addition, the followers of Islam have other major articles of faith: recitation of five daily prayers; observance of Ramadan (a monthlong period of fasting and self-examination) giving of alms (zakat); and, if possible, a pilgrimage to Mecca, the birthplace of Mohammed. The most important religious service is held at midday each Friday.

Islam divides into four interpretations: Hanafi, Shafai, Hanbali, and Maliki.

In the century after the death of Mohammed, Arab muslim armies conquered the Middle East, North Africa, Spain and southern France.

Although Muslim influence was prevented from spreading farther into Europe after Charles Martel's Christian military victory at Tours in 732, Islam continued its eastern growth. It served as a unifying force among the many Arab tribes.

Islam's missionary organization, the Ahmadiyya movement, was founded in 1889 by Hazrat Ahmad (1835-1908). It brought Islam to the U.S. in 1920. Today a majority of persons in 57 nations are Muslims.

Until recently, Islam had no organzied missonary movement. But today Al-Azhar University of Cairo,

the intellectual center of Islam, trains students for missionary work. Several Islamic sects, especially the Abmadiyya of Pakistan, work as missionaries throughout Europe, America, Asia, and Africa.

We had intense discussion among ourselves as to what we should put forward for consideration and reached harmonious consensus on each issue upon which we wished to comment. I must say that we thoroughly enjoyed the experience and learned quite a lot. Insha Allah, we shall be able to state our proposals and position on issues with even greater facility in future.

Congratulations and thanks to you for breaking new ground in this area, opening up new posibilities for carrying forward the work of Ahmadiyyat with ever-increasing enthusiasm and expansion. Under your direction, the meeting moved forward in fine fashion with time saving, efficient management to complete the agenda. We note the following points.

(I) The courteous, scholarly presentations by the attendees laid the groundwork for exten-

sive development in each area.

TABLIGH - (2) Most of the proposals have excellent potential for effectively carrying the Message of Ahmadiyyat. Lajna would like to see the national tabligh plan of action focussed on two target cities: Zion and Washington, D.C. A united effort of Lajna and all the other auxiliaries could be most effective in promoting the cause of Ahmadiyyat and Islam. Washington is the political, cultural and educational center; these institutions may be utilized in creative ways; also, there is access to officials of many organizations which are based here; additionally, the center (headquarters of our Community) would be nearby.

Zion is situated near the site of our next convention and this would be helpful in laying a foundation for our work in this area of the U.S. Further, this would demonstrate fulfillment of prophecy for our effort to be concentrated in Zion as well.

We thought of the possibility of our hosting an "Exposition of Islam" wherein exhibits and demonstrations would be given on the Holy Quaran; Islamic concept of God; Basic beliefs of Islam; The Islamic marriage, family, etc.; Hajj Pilgrimage; The Life of the Holy prophet (s.a.w.); the life of the Promised Messiah (pboh); Islamic social customs; the role of women in Islam; and other interesting facets of our faith.

EDUCATION - (3) Lajna recommends that an active national secretary for Atfals be made responsible for training Ahmadi boys in a national program, similar to the national Nasirats program.

BUDGET - (4) Lajna recommends funds for radio/television tabligh be earmarked specifically in the budget, as electronic media is a clearly effective information tool.

USA AHMADIYYA JAMAATS ACTIVITIES

CLEVELAND

By the grace of God, the Cleveland Jamaat continues to grow and thrive. This month we were gratified to receive Missionary-in-Charge USA Sheikh Mubarak Ahmad Sahib, as well as Bro. Muzaffar Ahmad Zafar, President Jamaat Ahmadiyya USA, as our guests. Our latest meeting, with the above as Guests of Honor, was held on Dec. 9, 1984.

Sheikh Mubarak Ahmad Sahib spoke eloquently on the difference between Ahmadies and the various other sects of Islam. Sheikh Sahib went on to review the latest developments in Pakistan concerning the persecution of Ahmadies and the outlook for the Jamaat Ahmadiyya in the immidiate future. This talk was followed by a very lively question and answer period in which several of our invited guests posed some excellent questions. Sheikh Sahib handled these quesitons with poise and accuracy to everyone's satisfaction. Some specific quesitons concerned the finality of the Holy Prophet (S.A.W.), and whether or not the Promised Messiah was a prophet, messiah, or "guru" (as one non-Ahmadi lady chose to refer to him). About 50-60 members and guests were in attendance. Afterwards lunch was served to all and prayers were offered.

Later that evening Sheikh Sahib met several more members over dinner at Bro. Harold Salam Rice's home (President Cleveland Jamat). This was followed by more questions and answers. Prayer behind a non-Ahmadi Imam, organ transplants and donations, family planning, cremations, and treatment of contemporary customs and traditions that have been creeping into the practice of Islam were discussed.

The Cleveland Jamat is actively investigating potential mosque locations. As one of the oldest established jamats in American, it has long been our most fervent desire to have our own mosque. We are presently renting quarters for our regular meetings, at a considerable expense. Over the years our membership has been most generous and punctual in submission of their chandas and participation in all special requests and fund projects. ROCHESTER

Our monthly meeting was held at Abdul Haleem sahib's residence in Rochester on Dec. 30 at 11:30 a.m. With our president on the chair, the meeting started with the recitation of the Holy Quran by Naveed Ahmad sahib followed by the translation. After a poem of Hazrat Khalifatul Massih the 2nd. previous month's report was presented to the Jama'at. There was a little addition in the report namely as Dr. Nasar Sahib was elected for the Gen. The president also welcome a new member of Jamaat Dr. Fazl-ur-Rehman sahib who now resides in Buffalo. This time we also had a guest with us Dr. Riaz Ahmad sahib Chaudhry from Fairlawn (NJ) along with his family. After joint Dua which was led by Dr. Riaz Ahmad sahib the meeting ended with the khutba of Hazoor which he had delivered in London on Dec. 7 1984.

The president thanked the host family for going into trouble of arranging for this meeting. May Allah bless them Amen. Later on after Zuhr and Asr prayers the meeting came to an end.

DAYTON

Thirty-three (33) persons are being preached to. Each member has designated at least one person to be propogated to. Some have selected two or more. To date, one family of five has accepted, and one single lady. Another lady has completed her biat form and should be formally accepted into our

jamaat on Friday, November 9th, 1984, Insh'Allah. Dayton's preaching plan is:

The last Thursday of each month is set aside specifically for preaching persons being propogated to by members. This meeting is informal in nature. Any questions persons have concerning Islam are answered at this time.

Lajna has set aside time in their weekly meetings for women interested in Islam to have their questions answered. This past weekend, Lajna hald an Itjima at the mosque and invited guests. Before one of the women guests left, she requested a bait form to study and sign this Friday, November 9th, 1984. One man being propogated to is attending Jummah services regularly.

In regards to jamaat activities, we are holding Jummah services every Friday. Quran classes are held every Sunday from 11:00 am to 12:00 pm. During this time, the speeches of Huzur are also heard. (We currently do not have a translator, so we listen to the Urdu.)

The financial reporting problems our jamaat was undergoing have been corrected, Insha'Allah. We are currently reviewing Chaanda Aam rates with each member and encouraging every one to pay according to their income. We are computing each member's income according to the stipulated rate of 1/16th.

WASHINGTON DC

FAMILY DAY (CHILDREN/PARENTS DAY) OF SOUTH EAST REGION CELEBRATED ON DECEMBER 25, 1984, AT AMERICAN FAZL MOSQUE, WASHINGTON, D.C.

The day started with recitation of the Holy Quran conducted by Br. Kalim Bhatti of York, PA and poem was recited by Malik Mubarak Ahmad sahib. The Washington President Br. Mubasher Ahmad then requested Sheikh/Mubarak Ahmad to make his inaugural speech.

Amin Sahib started his speech with the recitation of this verse: Who strive to meet us - we will surely guide them in our ways (Holy Quran 29:70). He stressed upon the Ahmadi children to first strive hard and pray to God for his help. He reminded them the Promised Massiah strived hard in remembering God and was shown the right path. He received clear visions and revelations from God. Amir Sahib referred to the well known incident

when Hazur were influenced by some great men to go the Batala for debate with Molvi Mohammad Hussain Sahib. Hearing the views of the Molvi sahib and finding no point of difference Hazur refused toe nter into any debate. The people around him who were expecting a big victory against Molvi Mohammad Hussain were displeased but Huzur did not care. Allah was pleased with him so much that the same night He sent a revelation saying "I am very much pleased with your action and I will bless you so much that even the kings will seek blessing from your garemnts." He was also shown few kings in his vision.

Maulana sahib said that we believe in a living God who speaks even today and that is a point of difference between us and others.

Next items were contest of Tilawat - impromptu and prepared speeches. Atfal and Nasirat participated in these programs separately. The contest was based on the age groups of 7-10 years, 11-14 years and 15-18 years of age.

Moderator was Br. Yahya Shariff, S.E. Region President. The prepared speeches topic for 7-10 age group was "Islamic Etiquettes in the Home" and for the 11-14 age group was "Etiquettes of Islam Outside the Home" and for the 15-18 age group was "Tabligh opportunities for Muslim Youth." Next item was general knowledge contests. Every member participated. A video tape of Hazrat Khalifatul Masih Raba's Majlis Irfan in London was shown to the members. After a program of games for the youth there was break for lunch and Zohar and Asr prayers.

The next item was the Panel Discussions:

Topic for children's discussion was "Islamic Environment in the Home." The moderator was Jawad Malik of Washington Jamaat. The participants were: Haroon Asad of York Jamaat, Anser Ahmad of Washington Jamaat, and Amar Latif of Washington Jamaat. This discussion was very much appreciated as the participants showed keen interest in their subjects and the discussion was quite mature and serious. All the participants stressed on many good points like learning in early childhood starting from Azan in the ear of the new borns; parent's own example, learning Quran, prayers, doing good to others, forgiveness, being grateful and many other good deeds.

Next the elders Panel discussion, particiapted by: Br. Yahya Sharif of York Jamaat, Maj. A.R. Moghul of Washington Jamaat, and Ch. Allah Bakhsh of Washington Jamaat. The moderator was Br. Mubasher Ahmad. The topic of the discussion was "Todays Children are Tomorrows Adults."

The discussion was opened by Br. Yahya Sharif who stressed that mother was the best teacher for the children. He also stressed on Taqwa and said that fear and love of God bring a balance in life. "Small things can do a lot," he said. "Education and of good health" was another point. He explained that both body and soul be developed uniformly as "healthy brain is carried by healthy shoulders." He also stressed on prayers.

Maj. A.R. Moghul cited the incidents from the life of Hazrat Yakub and the Promised Messiah to stress that parents should be keenly interested and be careful about the upbringing of their children.

Lastely Ch. Allah Bakhsh Sahib spoke on psychological aspects of how a child learns and how his physical and mental facilities develop. Citing the results of recent research he said that child starts learning immediately after birth. Explaining the various stages of learning he stressed upon parents to be particularly careful about their children at the crucial stage when they enter into adulthood. They must have effective communications with their children in this age of confusion and drawing conclusions and making decisions. He said that Hazrat Khalifatul Masih's grouping of Jamaat in Atfal, Khuddam, and Ansars, rightly falls in line with the present ideology and is a very useful and prudent move.

· After this useful and informative discussion Sheikh Sahib was requested to distribute awards and prizes to the winners in the contests.

The President of Southeast region then thanked everybody and requested Maulana Sahib to give his concluding remarks and lead Dua.

Maulana Shaib recited the verse: So when thou art free from thy immediate task, strive hard. (Chap. 94:8) and aske the members to pray for the health of Sahibzada Mian Muzaffar Ahmad Sahib who was sick and could not attend the meeting. He also asked for prayers for the health of Dr. Khalil Ahmed Nasir Sahib of New York who was in hospital. Referring to the controversy about the T.V. which cropped up during the childrens question/answer session, he said it can not be condemned outright. It has good uses also like we have just seen and heard Huzur on T.V. - but addiction to T.V. is very bad and should be curbed.

He said that Jamaat should arrange to prepare taped lessons based on religious teaching and training for the children and distribute them among the members. This can be very useful Tarbiyyat and religious knowledge.

Turning to the panel discussion he quoted Hadith about children being born on Fitrat (clean slate) and only parents make them Jews or Christians and also mentioned the Hadith that the Paradise lies under the feet of mothers. He stressed that parents have big responsibility to train their children.

He also said that such meetings are very useful and should be announced well in advance and children should be prepared to participate in all the competitions.

At the end Maulana Sahib thanked God, organiers and all members and said that he has enjoyed this meeting. At this time Brother Saleem Mohaiman and his wife were pronouced as recipient of the Best Parent of the year and received an award.

- The regular jamaa't meeting, previously scheduled for Jan. 13, 1985 at the Birmingham Y.M.C.A., will not be held. Instead, the Zuhr and Asr prayers will be offered on Jan. 13 at the new mission house.

Milwaukee

As a Community Social Project, the Milwaukee Jamaat is active as an Emergency food pantry. Our pantry distributes food to needy families on a daily basis.

Our Jamaat President along with several other members has acquired food from different resources. They include F.E.M.A. Grants from the United Way.

We are members of The Hunger Task Force of Milwaukee. We are also members of the Hunger Action Network of Milwaukee. The first group was designed to co-ordinate and find funding and other resources for emergency food distribution. The second group was designed to act as a coalition to change legislation to help the families that use the facilities of the food pantries.

During the month of November we gave food to fifty-five families. These families consisted of sixtyfive adults and one hundred fifteen children. In the month of December we gave food to fifty-seven families. These families consisted of sixty-seven adults and one hundred twenty-five children.

Each family received food for two or three days of a fairly balanced diet. We give two or three bags of groceries. It depends upon the size of the family. For those two months we gave approximately 1,800 pounds of food Alhumdolilah!

Our clients are people who are unemployed or have had their food stamps lost or stolen. But whatever the reason, we try to help. Most pantries only serve people within their zipcode or so-called boundaries. The Ahmadiyya Movement in Islam Food Pantry has no such boundaries. We are also open Monday through Thursday from eight a.m. to two forty-five p.m.

We gave twenty copies of The Philosophy of The Teachings Of Islam. We gave ninety-two copies of What is Ahmadiyyat to these families.

Our continued work in this area makes us realize that America should spend time looking after the needs of the citizens of this country as well as Third World Countries.

Please pray that Allah Tala will allow us the means to continue to provide this service for as long as it is necessary.

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Islam also teaches to respect the revered Teachers who came to different parts of the World at different times. It teaches that every nation received a guide and we, as Muslims, must not make any distinction in the matter of accepting and honouring all of those teahcers and prophets.

The title of this feature was "FIVE ARTICLES OF ISLAM". Amjad Khan first presented a seven minute prememorized speech on the beauties of Islam. Audience were impressed by his presentation because of his age (5 yrs.). Followed by Amjad was a speech by Taha Ahmad on the first Article of Islam, i.e. Oneness of God. He presented the uniqueness of Islamic faith by the announcement of Kalima.

GIST OF FRIDAY SERMONS

BY Sheikh Mubarak Ahmad Ameer & Missionary Incharge, USA Delivered at Fazal Mosque, Washington, jD.C.

November 30, 1984

The following verse from the Holy Quran was recited: "So obey not the disbelievers and strive against them by means of the Quran with a mighty striving." (25:53) Before explaining the significance of the verse, Sheikh Mubarak Ahmad read a letter about the situation in Pakistan. This pertained to the decision of the so-called Sharriyat Court and the abuses and the false accusations being spread about the Promised Messiah. From the text of the letter it

appeared that there was a serious danger of another ordinance being made by the Government of Pakistan ordering the demolition of the domes and changing the shape of our mosques. Hazoor had asked in his letter that all the Ahmadis should pray a great deal and continue to exhort others for prayers.

Commenting on the verse recited in the beginning Ameer Sahib said that we, the Ahmadis have real Islam. It is our duty to establish it in the world as well as in our lives. This included adopting Islamic etiquettes in everyday life. Almighty Allah exhorts us not to follow the ways of disbelievers. Proper dress, and wearing of a head cover is an essential Islamic etiquette which must be followed especially in the mosque and on all Jamaat functions. Similarly, he said, sisters should also observe the Islamic code of dress. If we do that we will receive honour and dignity in this world and pleasure of Allh, both here and in the hereafter.

December 7, 1984

The following verse from the Holy Quran was recited.

"And obey Allah and obey his messenger, so that you may be shown mercy" (Chap. 3:133)

He then said that throughout the History of mankind it has been Allah's way that He and his messengers are victorious. This is what happened in the life of Hazrat Muhammad (s.a.w.) and this is what has been promised to us by following the Promised Messiah. In accordance with these prophecies Ahmadiyyat will succeed (Inshallah), but we have some responsibilities. These responsibilities are beautifully summarized in the verse: "Obey Allah and His Messenger, so that you may be shown mercy." Sheik Shaib contineud that in this respect one very important instruction of the Holy Prophet (s.a.w.) and the Holy Qur an is concerning Zakat. Zakat is one of the Five Pillars of Islam, and their are more than twenty-five verses in the Holy Quran emphasizing the importance of paying Zakat. At several places establishing the prayer and paying the Zakat have been mentioned together. Just as the establishment of congregational prayers is essential in a Muslim's life so is the payment to Zakat. All Ahmadis should therefore by very vigilent in discharging this obligation.

Sheik Sahih continued that payment of Zakat is a source of many blessings. The promise of Allah is that nobody's wealth shall decrease due to the pay-

ment of Zakat, instead, Allah will multiply the wealth and properties of those who pay Zakat regularly. Paying of Zakat is, therefore, not only an investment for welfare in the hereafter, but is also a big bargain in this world.

Sheik Sahib also asked all members to make it a habit that the different points of Islamic beliefs and teachings which are presented before them should be conveyed to others.

December 21, 1984

The following verse from the Holy Quaran was recited: "This day have I perfected your religion for you and completed my favor upon you and have chosen for you Islam as religion." (Chap. 5:4). It was explained that this verse was revealed during the farewell pilgrimage in which more than one hundred thousand companions joined the Holy Prophet (SAW). This event represented a tremendous change in comparison with the period 23 years earlier when the holy prophet had raised his solitary voice in Mecca. In that early period all, except a few, were against him but his voice crossed deserts and oceans. Eighty two days after the revelation of this verse the holy prophet passed away.

Once a jew met Hazrat Omar and said that if this verse had been revealed to Moses, the jews would have celebrated the day of that revelation as an Eid. Hazrat Omar replied that this verse was revealed on Friday, and that is an Eid for Muslims.

The religion of Islam has been chosen for us by Almighty God. The religion was not started by Hazrat Muhammad (SAW) rather it represented the highest development of the faith which Allah has sent down through his messengers from the beginning.

It is a perfect guidance for all times and ages. It is perfect both in quality and quantity. It contains guidance on all matters of physical, moral and spiritual import, and that guidance is perfect.

At the end it was stressed that we should invite all our friends to investigate the teachings of Islam. They will find no contradiction between the word of God, the Holy Quran, the work of God and laws of nature. Several recent discoveries have confirmed the truth of that claim. Moreover, Islam establishes a true equality of brotherhood among mankind that is why Hazrat Bilal was addressed as "our master" by the Khalifa - Hazrat Omar.
